### Atlantic City Fete Slated By Mesta For 'Old Friends'

Washington — Perle Mesta is speeding up her party pace. Already she's getting ready for the forthcoming Democratic political convention in Atlantic City, Aug. 24-27, where she expects to put on "the best of parties for my old friends, the Johnsons."

Luck has a lot to do with social success. Twice, the former Minister of Luxembourg has fortunately been close to senators before, not after, they became President. The Truman were favorite guests long before the Missouri Senator was elected vice-President and then became the President on the death of President Roosevelt. In fact, Senator Truman made a hit at some of Mrs. Mesta's informal parties by playing the piano.

She wasn't on such a cozy basis with another senator who became President, John Kennedy, and she made no secret at the 1960 Los Angeles Democratic convention that she preferred Senator Lyndon Johnson for the Presidential nomination. She even publicly said she would vote for Republican Richard Nixon rather than Democrat Kennedy.

When Lyndon Johnson became Vice-President, Mrs. Mesta's lovely home was sold to the Johnsons along with some furnishings collected in her travels. So the intimacy has continued and she's now a frequent guest, at big and small functions, at the White House.

The 26th annual convention of the League of Women Voters in Plattsburgh this week will be remembered as the one where the League bravely took on the civil rights issue, in concentrating on the educational, employment and housing aspects of the controversy.

Senator Philip Hart (D. Mich.) is no wise-cracking Bob Hope, but he agreed — "somehow apprehensively" — to take part in a make-believe hilarious different kind of political convention staged by the Women's National Press Club for the entertainment of visiting editors.

## North Country Kitchen...

Are you an experienced pastry baker? If so, then you probably know all about creating tender, yet flaky pastry. But if you prefer to use a mix, then you either want the saving in time offered by mixes or you want to avoid the problems you have encountered with pastry.

Good pastry is supposed to be both flaky and tender, but these characteristics are not truly compatible. The more tender the pastry, the less flaky it may be. So our aim is to have a little of both desirable features in a pastry crust.

Tenderness and flakiness are largely influenced by the choice of shortening. Fats which become the softest while being incorporated into a dough seem to make the tenderest pastry. The soft fat covers the flour particles to reduce the uptake of liquid. In this way, gluten development is minimized, and so is toughness. Probably the highest rated solid fat for tender pastry is lard. On the other end of the scale are butter and margarine, which, largely because of their water content, make the least tender pastry.

The particles of solid fat left in a dough contribute to flakiness. By using oil or by combining too thoroughly the fat and flour, a mealy or crumbly pastry will be produced, rather than one which is termed flaky. Therefore, while it is desirable to adequately combine the shortening with the flour in order to produce tenderness, some remaining pieces of solid fat are still essential to produce flakiness.

Whether you use a mix or make your own pastry for the following pie is your choice.

## Girl Scout Camp Plans Underway
