

Potsdam State Tennis Squad Defeats Siena

A 7-2 victory over Siena Saturday gave Potsdam State's tennis team a split in two week end games as it launched its 1964 season on the road. Friday Coach Bob Serfis' Bears bowled to Albany State for their first loss since 1962.

Potsdam's downfall in the Albany State match was their inability to win singles matches. The only Bear to triumph in individual play was Gus Baxter, Potsdam, who came from behind to win his No. 3 singles match in three sets. Potsdam swept the doubles competition, but only after the match was out of reach.

At Siena the next day it was a different story. Baxter, one of the team's most consistent performers, lost in three sets but the team won. Winning singles matches were Pete Burvenich, Doug Ilie, Lyle Crofoot and Barr Aiken. Siena's two victories in singles play were as close as they ever got to match victory. Winning doubles for Potsdam

were the combinations of Burvenich and Baxter, Ilie and Larry Poole, and Crofoot and Aiken.
