

Teenage Safe Driving Road-E-O Set May 16, 17

Many area high school students who drive cars are expected to compete in the Annual Potsdam Jaycee's "Tennage Safe Driving Road-E-O" to be held May 16 and 17 at the Potsdam Central School and the Potsdam Shopping Center.

The annual event is part of the Potsdam Junior Chamber of Commerce Traffic Safety Program, which this month includes the Road-E-O, and the large sign which was erected last week end at the intersection of Market and Main Streets in the village, as a reminder to drivers in and through the village. The sign reads "WHO WILL BE NEXT?", and then goes on to give the number of accidents within the Village of Potsdam now as compared to the same period last year. This sign will remain for the rest of the year, and figures will be changed periodically.

According to Karl Wisner, driver education instructor at Potsdam Central School and chairman of the Jaycee Traffic Safety Program, teenage per-

mit holders and operators will meet in Room 122 at the Potsdam Central School at 1 p.m. May 16 to take the written test and to see a film on the 1963 National Jaycee Teenage Road-E-O, where 50 out of 500,000 teenage drivers competed for \$4,900 in prizes plus a new Mercury convertible.

The driving skills exercises will be held on Sunday, May 17 at the Potsdam Shopping Center at 1 p.m. Awards presentation will be made on Sunday at 4:30 p.m. in the Potsdam High Auditorium. Awards will include: First Prize, \$25 and trophy; Highest Scoring Girl, \$20 and trophy; 2nd Prize, \$15; and third prize, \$10. All contestants will be awarded a certificate of participation.
