Clarkson Establishes Prof. Allison Award

An annual award has been established at Clarkson College in honor of Professor Emeritus William Henry Allison, professor of Civil Engineering at the College from 1929-1959.

Established by Joseph Fraioli, a 1935 graduate of Clarkson, the award is for \$100 and was to be presented for the first time during Moving Up Day Ceremonies.

Chosen by faculty members of the Civil Engineering Department, the recipient is Robert Thrasher, of Rome, a senior who has demonstrated outstanding ability in structural engineering.

During his thirty years of devoted service to Clarkson, Professor Allison was a highly respected educator with a reputation as a friend of the students.

A graduate of Dartmouth College, he came to Clarkson in 1929 as an Assistant Professor, was promoted to Associate Professor in 1937, be-


