Diocese Youth Will Celebrate Adoration Day

On Sunday, May 17, the Feast of Pentecost, teenage boys and girls from the Diocese of Ogdensburg will join with millions of Catholic youths in every part of the United States in the annual observance of Youth Adoration Day.

It is planned that in the Ogdensburg Diocese the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the altar of every parish church from noon until evening, and during that time individual Catholic teenage boys and girls will spend a half hour of private prayer and adoration.

Further plans are being made for all teenagers to receive Holy Communion at one of the Masses in their respective parish churches on Pentecost Sunday and a spiritual bouquet be made by the youths of each parish to the Most Reverend Thomas A. Donnellan, newly appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Ogdensburg.

A special booklet entitled "Jesus and I" is being made available for the youths to use during their Holy Hours on Pentecost Sunday as well as at other times for private visits to the Blessed Sacrament. Copies of this very practical youth Holy Hour book may be obtained by writing to the Catholic Youth Council, Old Forge, N. Y.

Adult groups in many of the parishes of the diocese are co-operating with the youths for Youth Adoration Day, and it is understood that in some of the parishes special Communion breakfasts or suppers are being held. It is hoped that every teenager in the Diocese of Ogdensburg will participate in Youth Adoration Day, Sunday, May 17.
