

# Ohio Republicans Stage Giant Rally

It's no secret that leaders of the Republican Party in New York State and especially in St. Lawrence County have been concerned for some months now in upgrading their image and wiping out the stigma of last November's Democratic - swept election, which was a disaster as far as the GOP was concerned.

Although much of this Democratic luster may have been wiped away by what many people consider the "mess in Albany" created by the feuding Democratic Legislature, there are important elections coming up this fall, and GOP masterminds would like nothing better than to "beef up" their own household before the campaigning begins, as they feel they have a good chance to gain back some of the ground lost with the Johnson coat-tailing.

Well, if Seward Brown and his cohorts are looking for a unique idea to help hold the troops in line, maybe they should look to the State of Ohio, and a little shindig put on last week by the Ohio Republicans which was considered the largest gathering of GOP supporters in this State in history. It's purpose was twofold—to raise some \$1.2 million for the party; and also as a morale booster throughout the State, as Ohio Republicans had their troubles last November along with the rest of the country's GOPers.

Some 12,000 Republicans gathered in nine different cities throughout the State, all paying the traditional \$100-a-plate for dinner, and all hearing the main event of the evening, an address by former President Dwight Eisenhower from Cleveland on a special closed-circuit television set-up to each hall. Also speaking to the entire group was Ray Bliss, newly-appointed National Republican Chairman, who is from Ohio. Bliss was being honored at the affair, which was supposedly the main reason for the function, but the press in Ohio has indicated that the "morale-booster" was the main reason.

In addition to Ike's speech and the honors to Bliss, a prominent Republican was the speaker at each of the separate functions throughout the state. And the line-up read like a Who's Who Among Republicans: former Vice-President Richard Nixon in Columbus; California Senator and former actor George Murphy in Dayton; Charles H. Percy, unsuccessful candidate for Governor of Illinois and "shining young Republican star", speaking in Lima; Pennsylvania Governor William Scranton in Toledo; House Minority Leader Rep.

Gerald R. Ford in Canton; Senator Thurston Morton of Kentucky in Youngstown; and movie star Ronald Reagan speaking in Cincinnati. In addition, also speaking in Cleveland was Michigan Governor George Romney and Republican Governor James Rhodes of Ohio.

And outside of one Barry Goldwater, there just aren't many Republicans left who did not participate.

With the major portion of the ceremony last week televised state-wide, the Republicans must have made points somewhere, especially with their own party members. And what about New York State? Mr. Rockefeller is apparently determined to run again in 1966, and with other important elections coming up, it certainly is to be thought about trying the same idea.

Certainly in Northern New York, the appearance of a prominent national Republican leader would be welcomed within the next few months. The Democrats made undeniable inroads in the area last November, and managed to bring some of their "big guns" up with them—Bobby Kennedy on several occasions and even Sergeant Shriver of the Peace Corps in an unprecedented Democratic rally in Republican stronghold Potsdam.

New York Republicans should have the capabilities to line up a show similar to Ohio's sometime in the near future, and perhaps on a smaller scale, it would be a welcomed event in Northern New York.
