Jan Turcotte led the honor list at Potsdam Senior High School for June, with a 98.3 average. Closely following were Timothy Wyant, 96.7; Bernard Alpert, 96.4; Charles Prescott, 96.3; and Mary Barington, 96.0.

The five-day course which began Monday, June 28, will cover the construction and characteristics of refrigerator motors; theory and application of low voltage wiring; and general electrical principles.

Rosenbarker is employed by Agway, Inc. in Malone as an installation and repairman; and Cester is a manager trainee with Agway in Potsdam.

The course was taught by members of the Alfred Tech faculty. The college, one of 56 units of the State University of New York, is a two-year technical school which offers 29 courses of study in four major divisions.
