County ARC calls Measles a Danger

John C. Calnon, Massena, president of the St. Lawrence County Chapter of the Association for Retarded Children, announced today that this year's poster child for the National Association of Retarded Children is Kim Fisher of Ft. Wayne, Ind.

Kim, 10, was a normal child until the age of two when she developed encephalitis (inflammation of the brain) after an attack of measles. Since then she has been mentally retarded and deaf. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Guy W. Fisher, Kim has four sisters and a brother from two to fourteen years of age. Both parents work and Kim's grandmother takes care of the children.

According to Mr. Calnon, Kim was selected as the national poster child to dramatize the need for measles prevention. "Measles is not a harmless childhood disease," Mr. Calnon said. "It is actually the most deadly childkiller of any infectious disease. Each year 500 children die of measles and many thousands more suffer lifelong aftereffects — like Kim."

"We are joining the 1,000

units of our national association in an intensive campaign to eradicate measles. Only 12,000,000 children have been vaccinated, and there are at

least that many between nine months and 12 years who have not been," Mr. Canon said. We don't think parents should have to be shocked or scared out of their apathy and into action, but parents should check with their family doctors to see when and where immunization centers will take place."

Dr. Benjamin Spock, eminent pediatrician adds, "I urge every mother to have her child immunized. Now we can look forward to stamping out this particular cause of mental retardation."

In St. Lawrence County there are five local units of the Association covering every community nearby. These are located in Massena, Potsdam, Canton, Gouverneur and Ogdensburg. The Training Center at 735 State Street, Ogdensburg is operated for the entire county. Further information may be obtained by writing ARC, 735 State Street, Ogdensburg.

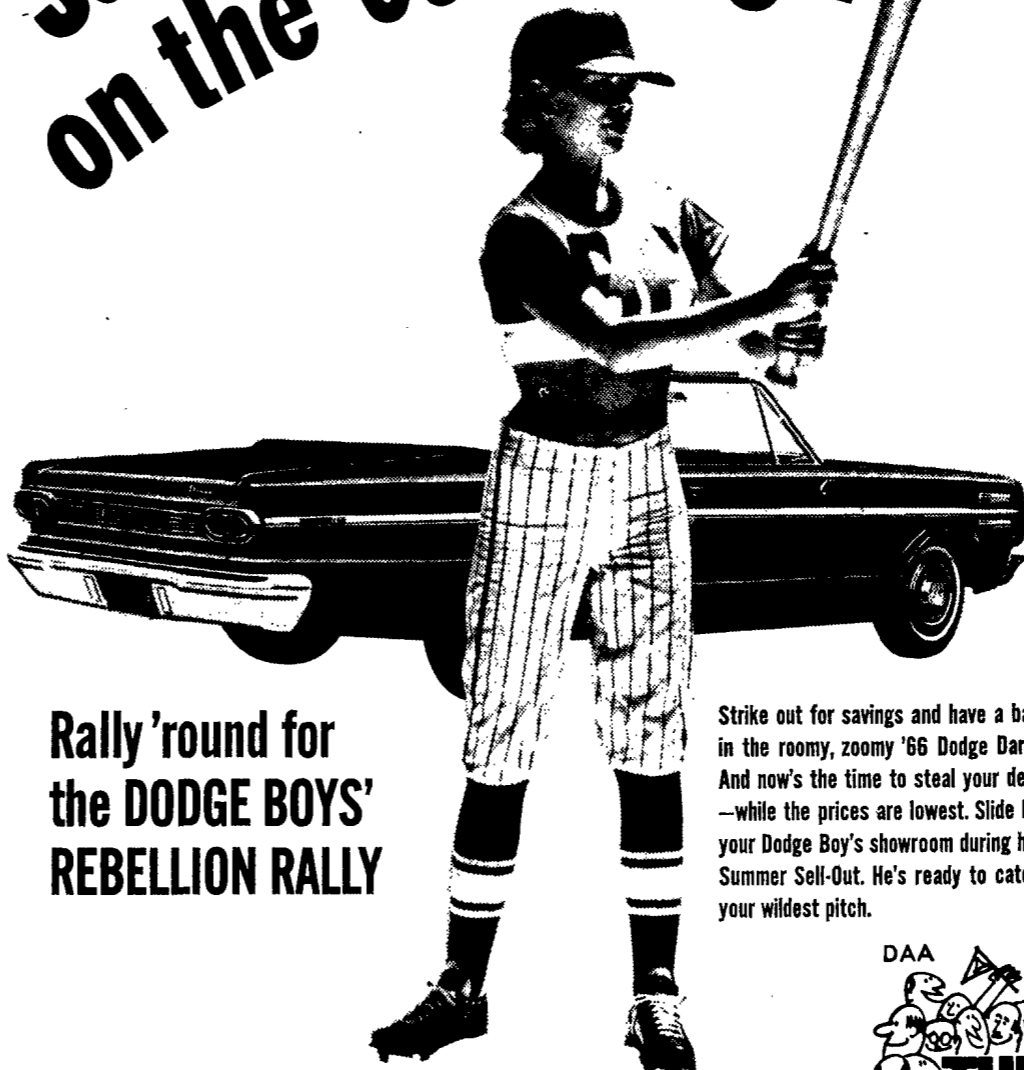

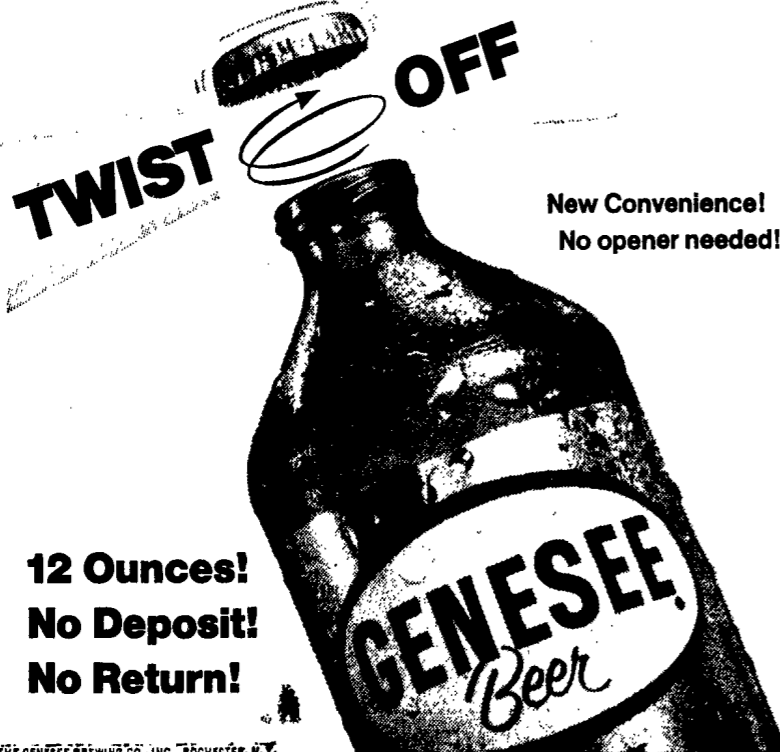
