Dr. John I. Green, chairman of the St. Lawrence County Conservation Education committee, gave awards of the "New York State Conservationist" magazine to the following students: First place, Miss Annette Pottle, Potsdam Central (Mrs. E. Spellman — teacher); Second place, Miss

Elke Chapman, Canton Grammar School (Mrs. F. Patty — teacher); Third place, Miss Jo Ann Smith, St. Mary's School, Canton (Sister Alice Therese — teacher).

The first place winner received a three-year subscription to the magazine, and second and third, a two-year subscription. The subscriptions were donated by the St. Lawrence County Federation of Sportsman's clubs represented on the committee by Stan Logan of Massena.

Thirty-five essays were chosen from the schools participating. Each reviewed the subject of the Conservation Field Day they experienced and what they had learned there.

The Conservation Field Day was termed a success during a recent evaluation session and another similar event is being planned for next fall. The committee also plans a conservation workshop for elementary teachers next fall.
