

ANYSPD insists Medicaid Amendments not Sufficient

The Department of Health, Education and Welfare has received a legal memorandum stating that the New York State Legislature's "last-minute amendment" to its Medicaid program "is too small a step in the right direction to remove the legal objections" raised by the Association of New York State Physicians and Dentists.

Within six weeks more than 2,900 members have joined the Association. There are about 32,000 practicing physicians and dentists in the state.

A memorandum in behalf of ANYSPD was presented July 13 to H.E.W. Undersecretary Wilbur C. Cohen by the group's legal counsel, Paul Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton and Garrison.

Basic arguments made in the memorandum are:

The deduction for families with incomes in excess of \$4,500 still does not limit eligibility, as required by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, to those medically needy and indigent persons whose incomes and resources are insufficient to meet the cost of medical service. Instead, the New York plan will continue to cover middle-income families whose earnings are well above those of the average factory production worker in both New York State and the nation.

The deduction passed by the State Legislature will save less than three per cent of the total cost of a program previously estimated to cost \$532,000,000 even in its first year by Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller and \$1,600,000,000 annually by health insurance

actuarists. Thus, the plan still requires a federal contribution roughly equal to the amount Congress intended to spend for all 50 states under this program.

The new deduction is still too small to prevent the wholesale cancellation by employers and individuals of their group health insurance plans. Instead, the New York plan will extend the stigma of a means test and the red tape of welfare medicine to nearly half the population of one of the nation's seven wealthiest states.

The legal memorandum continued:

Although the State Legislature has now adjourned, the New York Title XIX plan could still be made consistent with the statute and intentions of Congress if the following administrative rule changes were made by the New York State Department of Social Welfare.

●The net income eligibility standard — presently based on \$6,000 after taxes and medical premiums for a family of four — should be substantially reduced to more reasonable levels consistent with the language and objective of Title XIX.

●The unpublicized part of the plan which would make people with incomes even higher than these standards eligible to receive tax paid medical care should be dropped.

●The definition for the term "physical incapacity of a parent" should be more specifically restricted to prevent unwarranted claims for the medical expenses of parents aged 21 to 64 who are merely temporarily incapacitated.

●Stipulation should be made, for the protection of the state, requiring families claiming credit for health insurance premiums to maintain that insurance, or if eligible for participation in group insurance programs at their place of employment to claim any benefits payable under it.

WW II Vets J. Raymond wins ATC accepts Earl Cooklin

Eligible World War II veterans have just one year in which to take advantage of the GI Loan Program, reminded Walter F. Monteith, St. Lawrence County Veterans' Service Agency Director.

With the passing of each day, Monteith said, entitlement for many of these veterans ceases, with the final deadline for eligible World War II veterans applications set for July 25, 1967. Monteith noted that eligibility for entitlement expires according to a formula which adds ten years to the date of the veterans discharge from active wartime service, plus one year for each 90 days of that service. The resulting date is the individual deadline date for each veteran.

Veterans who were discharged for service-connected disabilities remain eligible until July 27, 1967, as do unmarried widows of veterans who died of service-connected disabilities. Those eligible under the program, the Veterans Official noted, may obtain a guaranteed loan to purchase a home, a farm, or to buy or start a business.
