Therefore, my column will consist of a small sampling of books filled with pages of laughter that perhaps will make your leisure hours carefree too. They are all available from our library and are all located in our Literature section.

"A Treasury of American Political Humor" edited by Leonard C. Lewin. 160-odd examples of the best in the art of humorous political writing, varying in style from biting satire to straightforward reportage and ranging in time from Revolutionary days to the present. Much of the contemporary selections appear in this anthology for the first time.

"2000 Insults for All Occasions" compiled by Louis A. Safian. A ready thesaurus of wit and quips for anyone who seeks a source of sharp barbs and quick comebacks as a speaker, writer or entertainer.

"Kids Sure Rite Funny: A Child's Garden of Misinformation" by Art Linkletter. A sample: "All stories have morals if we will just look for them hard enough. As a child, Goldilocks even taught me. She taught me not to eat other peoples food or get in other peoples beds."

"The Comic Tradition in America" edited by Kenneth S. Lynn. The place of the comic tradition in American literature is exemplified in this fine anthology. Authors ranging from Ben Franklin, Davy Crockett, Mark Twain, Chandler Harris, Herman Melville, Nathaniel Hawthorne are included.

"The Classics Reclassified"

by Richard Armour. Spoofs on our sacred classics including the Iliad, Julius Caesar, Silas Marner, Scarlet Letter, Moby Dick and David Copperfield. For the Richard Armour fans, however:

"...And Then I Told the President; the Secret Papers of Art Buchwald" by Art Buchwald. Art Buchwald needs no explanation and this book too is quite hilarious.

"The Hater's Handbook" by Joseph Rosner. A sampler of the rude, caustic comments; catcalls and malicious slander and gossip flung at persons of note throughout the ages. As the book blurb states "it is a guide to the wonderful world of ill will."

"Famous Last Words" by Barnaby Conrad. Witty, profound and tender sayings of the greats and near greats of our civilization.

"Filled with Laughter" by Rufus Lezarsl. A Fiesta of Jewish folk humor.

"The Pious Pornographers" by William Iverson. A tongue in cheek version of "An Anatomy of American Sex and Other Lively Habits".

Tax Deadline set August 1

Employers in Northeastern New York State have an important tax deadline on Monday, Aug. 1, 1966.

This is the due date for reporting and paying withheld income tax and social security taxes for the calendar quarter ended June 30, 1966, according to Donald T. Hartley, Albany District Director of the Internal Revenue.

Employers should use Form 941 to report their tax liability for this period.

Hartley pointed out that employers who made full and timely deposits in Federal Reserve banks or authorized commercial banks have until August 10 to file their returns.

"Employers Tax Guide", which furnishes more detailed information on this subject, may be obtained by writing to the District Director, Internal Revenue Service, 161 Washington Avenue, Albany, New York 12210.

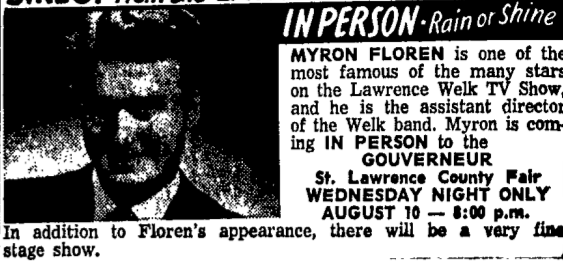
Manfred in Syracuse for Training Program
