### Servicemen's Voting Application available

New York State servicemen are reminded of their right and privilege to vote by military ballot. To obtain such a ballot, a serviceman may file an application or he may write a letter giving his full name and rank, his home residence address and his military address. Applications and letters must be signed by the serviceman but need not be sworn to nor attested. The spouse, parents or child

of a serviceman who accompanies him may also vote by military ballot. The Division for Servicemen Voting of the Department of State has post card applications available for any person or organization requesting them. A facsimile of this application is reproduced below.

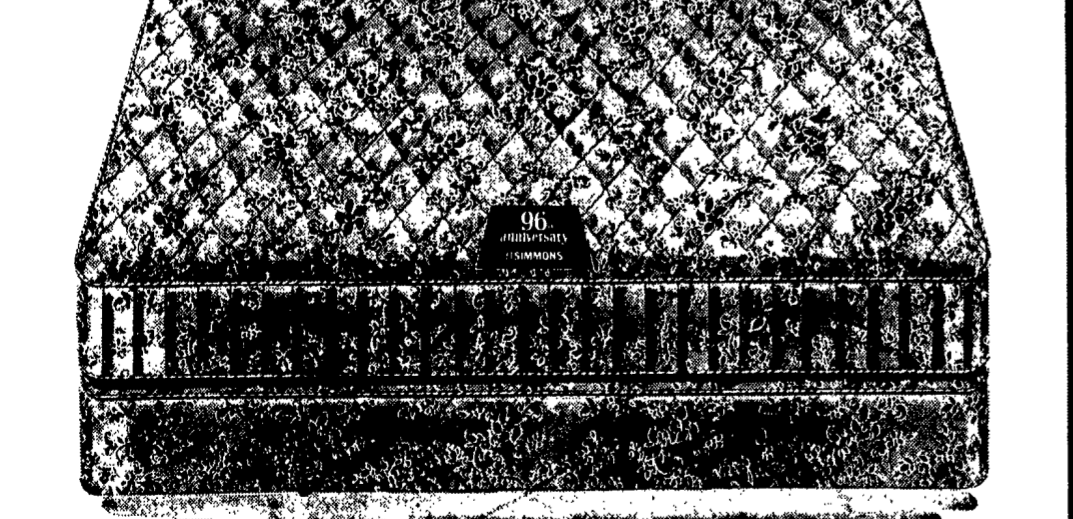
