

Funeral Rites set for Bartlett Youth

A 9:30 Requiem Mass at St. Mary's Church, Potsdam, preceded by a prayer at Garner's Funeral Home at 9 a. m. will be held Saturday, July 30 for James W. Bartlett, 18, son of Mrs. Theresa Dibble, Winthrop, Rt. 1. Burial will be in Hillcrest Cemetery, Parishville.

The youth, employed in a carnival near Somona, Calif. during the summer months, lost his life by drowning Saturday, July 23.

Swimming with companions in shallow water, the boy, who could not swim, waded out and stepped off a 20-drop. His companions were unable to save him.

Young Bartlett, employed for the second summer with his grandfather, Arthur Curry, by the Carnival Times show in California, would have returned home in the autumn.

Born in Potsdam Oct. 25, 1947, he was a son of Edward R. Bartlett, now of Rochester and Mrs. Theresa Bartlett. The boy lived with his mother who has remarried, and attended Parishville Hopkinton Central School.

He is survived by his parents, three brothers, a half-brother, and two half sisters, and his maternal and paternal grandparents.

The new clubhouse, located in a wing of the University Treadway Inn, includes a modern pro shop, full locker rooms and dining facilities, all of which are now being used by members of the St. Lawrence Golf & Country Club.

The new golf holes have been designed by Godfrey Cornish of Fiddler's Green, Massachusetts. Cornish, one of America's best-known golf architects, has designed championship layouts at Spring Valley Country Club near Boston, and Summer Lea Country Club in Montreal, Canada. Construction of the new portions of the course is being handled by Findley and Hall of Old Forge.

The first new hole is a par 4, 410-yard dogleg right, with a number of trees surrounding the tee. The second is a 230-yard par 3, with the green completely surrounded by bunkers. The new ninth hole will be a finishing test for the finest golfers. Measuring 370 yards, with strategically-placed fairway traps to catch errant tee shots and fairway wood shots, the green must be carried by a pitch shot. Also under construction is a full size driving range with fairway bunkers, and a complete

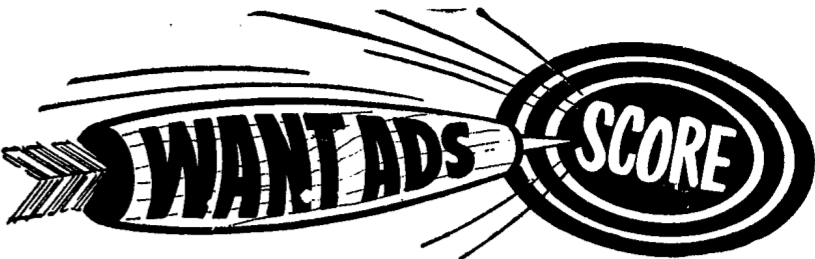
