Lawrence County Veterans' Service Agency have announced that Viet Nam Veterans (honorably discharged) are eligible to receive a peddler's license from the local County Clerk.

Military Ballots are available for servicemen and servicewomen for this Fall's election. Families with members in the service are urged

to obtain ballot applications and forward them to their members in service. Applications are available at local office of the N. Y. S. Division of Veterans' Affairs and Veterans' Service Agencies. Completed applications must be received by the Division for Servicemen's Voting, Albany, New York, 12225 on or before Oct. 27, 1966, or by the Board of Elections of the home

county of residence of the military voter on or before Oct. 28, 1966. Thereafter, applications may be filed in person at the Board of Elections until noon of Nov. 5, 1966.

Sole surviving sons in families where the father or other sons have died in service may now request discharge from the Armed Forces. This gives active duty men the same right not to serve as the Selective Service System gives to sole surviving sons of draft age.

Reentering Service? Get a copy of the Soldiers' & Sailors' Civil Relief Act — it tells of your rights to employment, as well as temporary suspension of enforcement of civil liabilities (debts, mortgages, etc.) you may be unable to pay as a result of your military service.

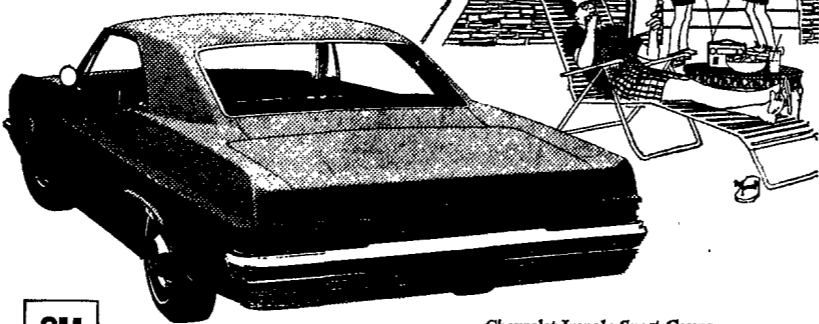
