

Youngman directs County Fair Band

Al Youngman, the man with the Golden Horn and Ivory Baton, will be back in his familiar position again this year at the Gouverneur and St. Lawrence County Fair directing the musical scores and creating a theatrical atmosphere for the television and recording stars and the supporting acts that will appear on the Open-Air Stage in the nightly Grandstand Shows that are now being arranged by the Fair Management.

Since 1960, this veteran Worcester, Mass. Maestro has been coming to Gouverneur to lend his talents to the featured Fair attractions.

Al Youngman's story is interesting and to say the least, is a supreme test of human endurance and fortitude. He clocks thousands of miles annually criss-crossing the County supplying the music for the Hamid-Morton Circus and for State and County Fairs. The itinerary of each annual tour includes engagements both in the United States and Canada playing in the coliseums and armories of such great centers as Chicago, Denver, St. Louis, Kansas City, Pittsburg, Memphis, Washington, Cleveland, Buffalo, Montreal, Toronto, and Quebec City. Most people would find under the strain of such travel and the pressure of showtime deadlines at such 'big time' engagements, but Youngman rolls with the punch.

Show business is his life and any other profession would probably have telling effects upon him. Youngman's chief occupation is directing the musical combo for the Hamid-Morton Circus, a role he assumed in 1964, when he succeeded Charlie Basile who will be remembered in this area as the talented Trombonist who led the professional Bands at the Fair in Gouverneur for nearly two decades. It was in 1960 that Basile was made Manager of the Hamid-Morton Circus and he continues to serve in that responsible position for George A. Hamid whose Indoor Circus is known far and wide as the greatest aggregation of Circus acts in the World today.

As Circus Band Leader, Al Youngman helps coordinate the various acts with the star performers and works out the details of the speciality numbers, always with the aim in view of presenting a smoothly running program. In this capacity, Youngman also puts into practice another of his fine talents, that of music arranger. He has written march-type, waltz-type and light operatic scores for the stage performing artists while he has also written jungle-type music arrangements for lions and tigers, and even came up with a "twist" specialty for the elephant act.

While his work with the circus takes up most of the year, Youngman spends the greatest share of each touring the County and State Fairs where he provides the Band Music for the Grandstand Shows.

His itinerary from late June until mid-October will find him doing his job at such Fairs as the Red River Valley in Fargo, N. D., the Delaware State Fair at Harrington, Del., the Chemung County Fair at Elmira, N.Y., the Maine State Fair at Skowhegan, Maine, the Champlain Valley Fair at Essex Jct., Vt., the Vermont State Fair at Rutland, Vt., and the Franklin County Fair at Malone.

Dr. Eigil Hestvedt is affiliated with the Institute for Geophysics in Oslo, and his visit to St. Lawrence was sponsored by the American Association for the Advancement of Science. He addressed institute classes and discussed problems with the participants and faculty members of the National Science Foundation - supported institute which is directed by Dr. Alfred Romer. The institute runs through August 12.

Dr. Hestvedt's principal research interest is in cloud physics, and he has written extensively on the physics of mother of pearl clouds. At St. Lawrence he talked on many topics relating to weather phenomena.

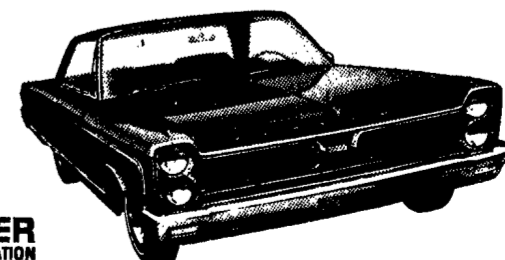
