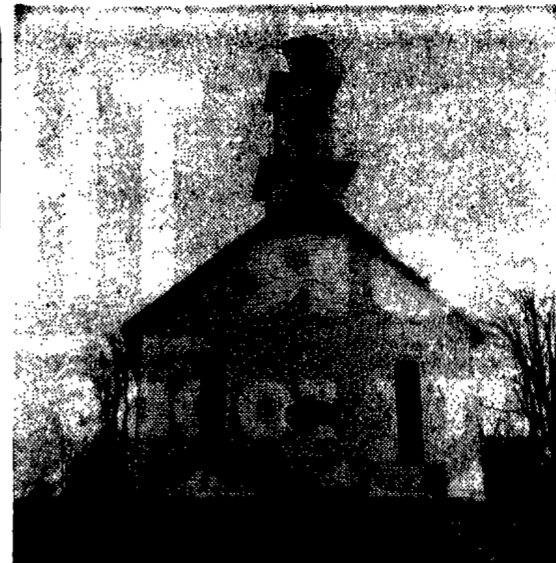

Garments Last Longer with Skillful Mending

Usefulness of clothes can be prolonged by timely and skillful mending, Cornell University home economists remind homemakers.

A Cornell bulletin, "Mending Fabrics," contains illustrated instructions on various methods of patching and darning. It describes how to mend lace, net, and knitted garments, as well as sheets, underwear, table damask, corduroy and other heavy-napped fabrics.

Machine darning is practical for repairing torn garters and straps, for mending holes that can be covered with replaced buttons, and for reinforcing thin places in trousers the author points out. The bulletin also explains when hand darning may be satisfactory.

Having a mending center in the home with sewing machine, ironing board and iron, supplies, tools, a comfortable chair, and a good light is helpful, says the author.
