AA, as the fellowship is commonly known, has had a rapid growth since its conception in 1934. Since then, it has grown from two people to over 350,000, estimated membership. These figures are not actual, as no regular records are ever kept of any AA meeting.

These intergroup meetings are held periodically in either Potsdam or Canton. They are held each month in other cities or villages in southern Canada and northern New York.

Alcoholics Anonymous is entirely self supporting. There are no dues or fees. It has been recognized as one of the leading factors in arresting this disease. Alcoholism has no class distinction in its choice of a victim. Every strata of society has its alcoholic and its recovered alcoholic.
