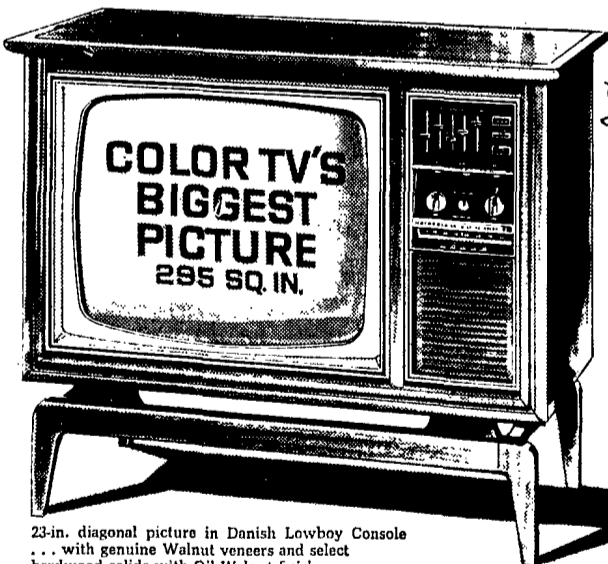
Sgt. Sanford was discharged earlier this month. He had been in the army for two years.

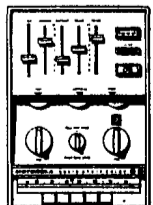

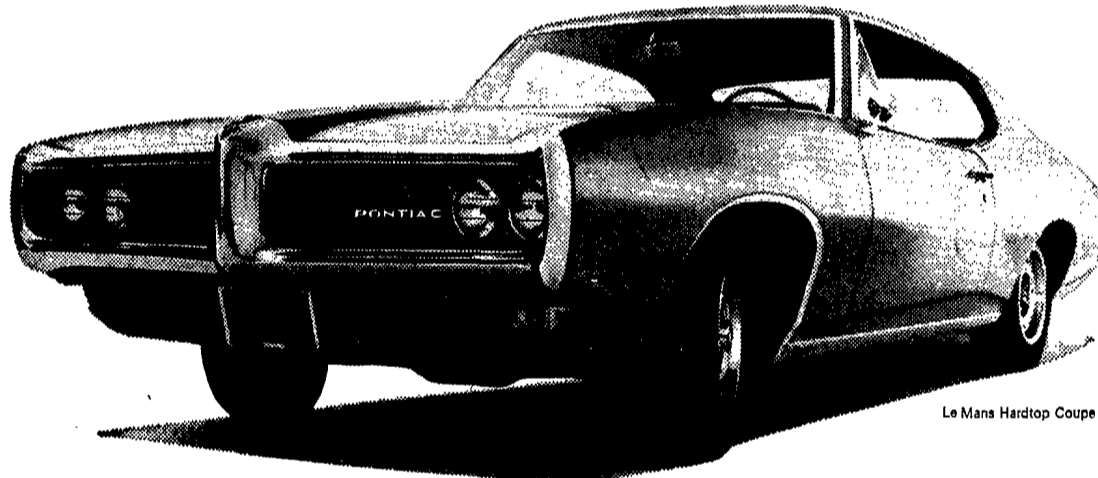

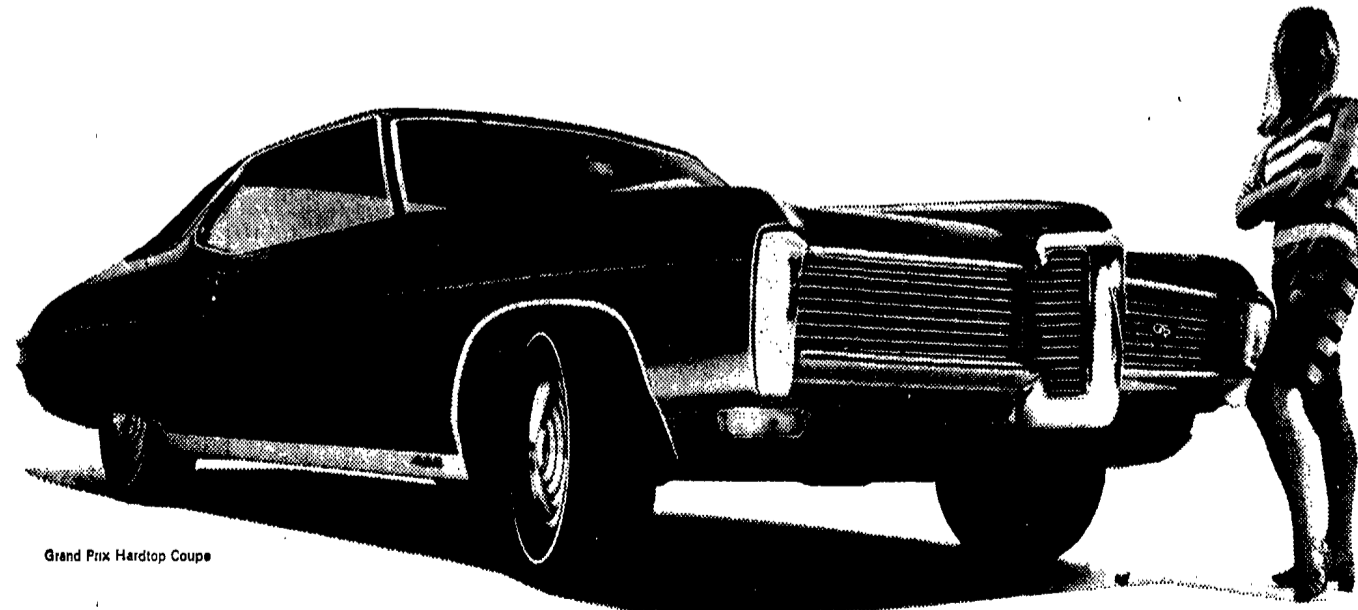
