

Parishville Board Approves Twelve Supply Teachers

The Parishville - Hopkinton Central School Board of Education approved 12 substitute teachers at its regular meeting Sept. 11. In addition, three substitutes were named for cafeteria work.

In other action, the board decided to advertise for bids for snow removal from school property in Parishville. Bids will be opened at the board meeting in October.

Also, the board announced that driver education courses will be taught on Saturdays this year as the school has had problems finding an instructor for the school week. It was noted that seniors will have preference for the course, followed by juniors and sophomores.

The board approved the request of Paul Planty to allow him to clear off the Bisnett property for a school playground. He will be allowed to sell the pupwood.

Mrs. Flora Miller was approved to attend the Elementary Principal's Conference Oct. 8-11.

The enrollment in the school is up 35 pupils over last year. The board noted that this made conditions especially crowded in the classrooms.

In other news from the Parishville-Hopkinton School, the re-construction of the heating system is rapidly drawing to a close with one of the boilers operating during the morning.

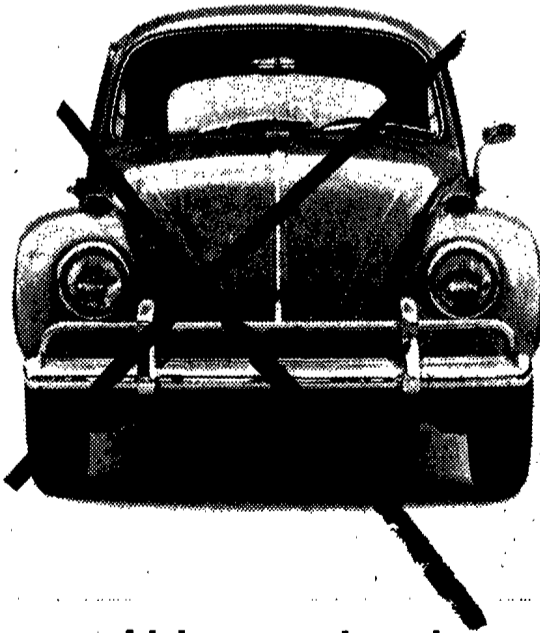

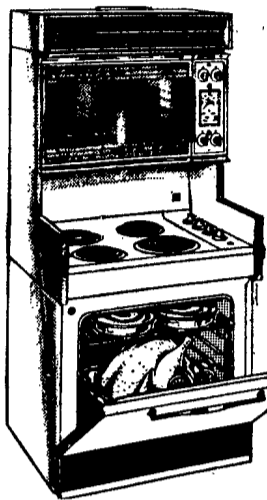
