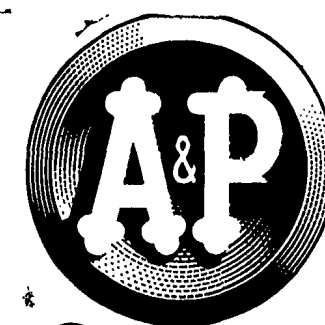

The dairymen's wives as well as others interested in milk promotion are also invited.

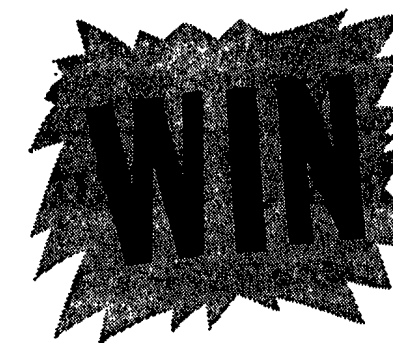
