\$69,000 Given Bishop's Fund

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Robert J. Arquet, diocesan director of the Bishop's Fund, announced Monday that the total reported for the Advance Gifts phase of the Appeal had reached \$69,194.65.

This represents the first Advance Gift reports from 64 of the 118 parishes in the Ogdensburg Diocese. The amount reported represents a sizeable increase over the amount at this time last year and indicates that the diocesan goal of \$300,000 will be reached.

The Most Rev. Thomas Donnellan, bishop of the Ogdensburg Diocese, in hearing of the reports to date, said: "I wish to take this opportunity to thank all those who have been so generous in this appeal for the works of the Diocese of Ogdensburg. The wonderful spirit and enthusiasm of the committeemen and donors so far has been a source of inspiration to me and to the entire North Country. I am deeply appreciative of and encouraged by the results so far in this year's appeal and I am sure that with the continued efforts throughout the parishes of the diocese during this week and next, we will exceed our goal of \$300,000."

The first parish or mission in the Diocese to exceed its 1966 total donations for the Bishop's Fund this year was St. Anthony's in Newton Falls with \$2,865.50 reported. An increase of \$158.00 over the final figure for 1966 with visits still to be made. The Rev. Joseph F. Dowd is pastor with Francis Foley, Murray Valentine and Desmond Holt as parish chairmen.

Catholic Youth Eligible for K of C Scholarship
R. Gerald Bradshaw, grand knight of Potsdam Council 340, has announced the start of the Scholarship Program, sponsored by the New York State Council of the Knights of Columbus.

Scholarships are open to any Catholic graduate of a recognized high school in New York State during the term ending in January or June 1968.

Candidates are required to submit to a preliminary regular college entrance test in scholastic aptitude given by the College Entrance Board on Dec. 2, 1967. Those becoming finalists as a result of this test will then be required to take the second examination on March 2, 1968.

The State is divided into 12 districts with three scholarships being awarded in each District. In addition, the Joseph S. Coffey, Jr., Memorial Award Scholarship (\$2,400.00) shall be made to the student receiving the highest grade in the finals on a statewide basis. Scholarships may be used at any Catholic College in the United States, and subject to approval by the committee. Applications must be filed with the State Committee no later than Oct. 28, 1967, and may be obtained from local high schools or from the grand knight of any council.
