Coach Saunders announced yesterday that the starting lineup would include Bowk and McBurnie at ends; Baker and Wells at tackles; Flanders and Clark at guard; Rose at center; VanDusen at quarterback Fullerton at fullback; and LaBrake, Myers and Mackey rotating in the halfback slots.
