Elected Training Director

The Rev. Leroy Stewart has been named director of Training for the Central New York Baptist Training program for the 1967-68 church year, it was announced by the Rev. John Tollison, secretary of Missions, Central New York Baptist Association.

The new director is a native of Pickens County, S.C. He was educated at D.W. Daniel High School, Clemson University, AIA, Clemson, S.C., Furman University, B.A., Greenville, S.C. and Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, Th. M., Wake Forest, N.C., - graduating in 1961.

Mr. Stewart is pastor of Emmanuel Baptist Church, a very young congregation dating from 1961. It is considered one of the youngest and fastest growing churches in New York. The young church, under his leadership, has recently completed an entirely new complex of church buildings on a seven acre tract, located on May Road. A new parsonage has just recently been completed.

Mr. Stewart is the second pastor of the church. Rev. Norman Bell, now pastor in Brushton, was a organizer, founder and first pastor of the church.

Prior to serving the church at Potsdam, the Rev. Stewart was pastor of the Eastside Baptist Church in Liberty, S.C. This church experienced great growth and doubled its mission giving and overall budget during his pastorate.

Mr. Stewart has also served as pastor of Friendship Baptist Church, Marietta, S.C. The church completed and dedicated a modern elementary educational building under his leadership.

He has also served as pastor of Garner's Baptist Church, Macon, N.C. and Vaughn Baptist Church, Vaughn, N.C. At the latter church a completely modern and new church facility was constructed.

He has also served as pastor of New Sandy Creek Baptist Church, Henderson, N.C. This church completed and dedicated a modern recreation facility under his leadership and was also recognized as one of the pioneer churches in the field of

church recreation in the state on North Carolina.

In secular work, Mr. Stewart was formerly associated with Stewart Lumber Company, Six Mile, S.C. He also served in the "Seabees" U.S. Later he was mayor of Six Mile, S.C. He is a Mason and Past President in Lions International.

He was married to Miss Lillian Murphree in 1947. Mrs. Stewart is a native of Pickens, S.C., and is a graduate of Draughn's Business College, Greenville, S.C. The Stewarts have two sons, Michael, 12, and Gregory, 4.

Mr. Stewart has been used widely in evangelistic meetings, having worked in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New York, North Carolina, Georgia, Virginia, and South Carolina. He has been used both in preaching, visitation, counseling, and the survey minis-

try of evangelism.

In 1966, he was invited by the Home Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Conference (SBC) to participate in an Evangelistic Crusade in the New England Area of Providence, R.I. He also worked in the Billy Graham Crusade held in Greenville, S.C., where he served as Counselor Advisor.

Last year Mr. Stewart was elected by the South Carolina Baptist Convention to a five year term on the Education Commission, as advisor to Furman University. The board chose him as one of the 20 administrative advisors for the university.

Earlier this year he was honored by the Home Mission Board, SBC, for his outstanding work in Potsdam and the northeast.
