

Retired Teacher Dies in Syracuse

Parishville—Mrs. Hilda C. Bassett, 65, of Parishville, wife of Everett Bassett, and a retired teacher and school supervisor, died late Friday in the Crouse-Ingalls Hospital in Syracuse. She had been ill several weeks.

Funeral services were conducted Monday at 2 p.m. at the Union Church, with the Rev. Harold Beaudry, pastor, officiating. Burial was in Hill Crest Cemetery, Parishville.

An OES service was held at 7:30 p.m. Sunday night at the Seymour Funeral Home.

Surviving, besides her husband, are a double cousin Mrs. Roy Nichols; other cousins and a sister-in-law, Mrs. Howard Charles of Massena.

Mrs. Bassett was born in South Colton Nov. 10, 1902, a daughter of Peter and Christine Charles. She was a graduate from the Potsdam Normal School. She taught school

in Hewittville, the Allens Falls School, and in Crane district for 15 years, after which she was supervisor and teacher in the Parishville schools until she retired two years ago.

On Oct. 1, 1927, she was married to Everett Bassett. The couple lived in Potsdam, then moved to Parishville in 1943, where they had lived since.

Mr. Bassett formerly worked for the Elliott Hardwood Lumber Co., then worked for Neokosa-Edwards Paper Co., until he retired in 1965.

Mrs. Bassett was a member of various teachers organizations. A member of the Parishville Union Church, and a 40-year member of Parish Chapter 91 of the OES of Parishville, of which she was a past matron.

Enrollment Up At M-W School

Madrid—Supervising Principal Donald J. Connor of the Madrid-Waddington Central School reports a marked increase in the enrollment in the three buildings of his school.

The Madrid Elementary as of Sept. 20 has five hundred and eight pupils; the Waddington Elementary, 289. The junior-senior high school reports 587, making a total school enrollment of 1,384.

Figures tabulated at this same time in 1966 recorded 489 in the Madrid Elementary with 272 in the Waddington Elementary and 565 in the junior senior high. This gave a total enrollment of 1,326.

Comparative figures from September, 1963, reveal an interesting growth factor over a four year period. Madrid Elementary then had 493 with Waddington Elementary 272. The junior senior high enrolled 500, making a total of 1,255.

District 3 will hold registration at the fire station in Lawrenceville.

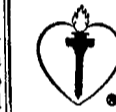
Remember you cannot vote in November unless you appear personally for registration. Once registered you will not have to register again unless you move or fail to vote for two consecutive years. Think this over.

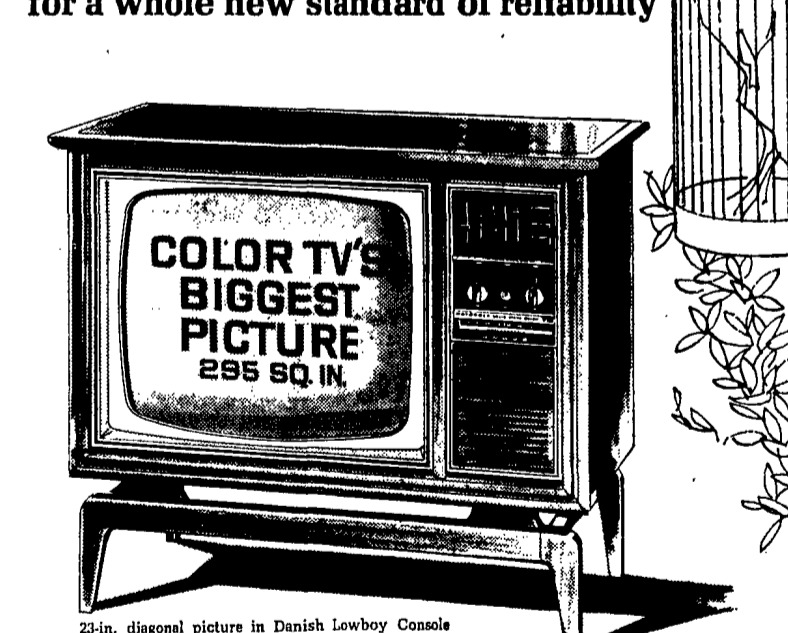

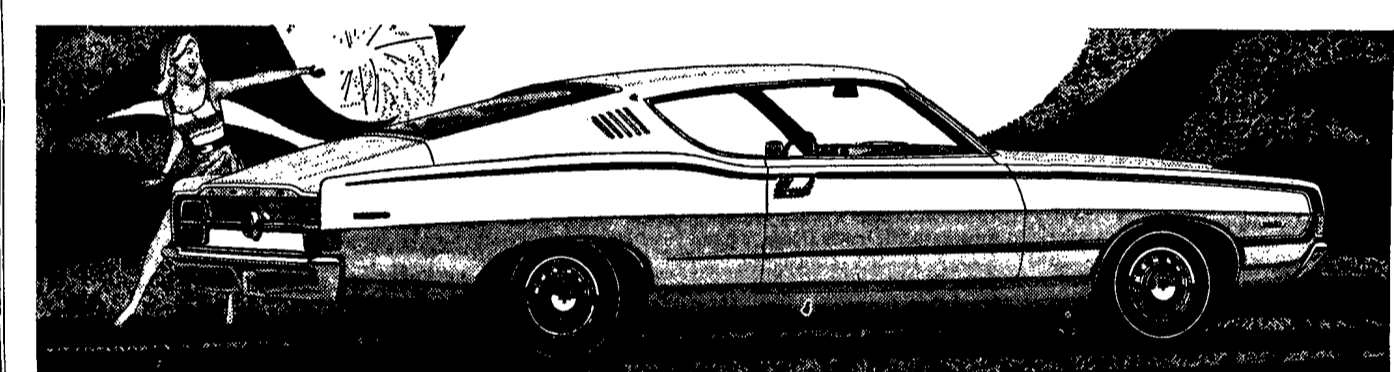
