To Tell of Christ, World Needs

Five missionaries will tell the story of Christ and the needs of the world this week Oct. 8 through 11, at the Emmanuel Baptist Church on May Road.
 Mrs. John Edward Taylor will be the first speaker, presenting her program Sunday morning at 11. She has served as a missionary to the migrants of Texas, Oklahoma, Georgia, Florida, and North and South Carolina.
 Mrs. David B. Howle is a Southern Baptist missionary in South Korea and a member of the Foreign Mission Board. Mr. and Mrs. Howle and their four children live in Wonju, Korea, where he is a field evangelist. She will speak at 7:30 Sunday evening.
 Monday, Oct. 9, the featured speaker will be John Kasa, pastor of the First Polish Baptist Church in Brooklyn. He and his wife are members of the Home Mission Board and are associate missionaries in the department of Language

missions. His talk will begin at 7:30.
 Dale G. Hooper, a Southern Baptist missionary in East Africa, will speak at 7:30 Tuesday evening, Oct. 10. Hooper has directed a Baptist community center in Nairobi and, prior to that was pastor of a number of Baptist churches in Kentucky and North Carolina. He has also been a chaplain in the U.S. Army Reserves, and a co-worker for the Kentucky Children's Home.
 The last speaker in the series will be Miss Lucy Wright Wednesday evening at 7:30. Miss Wright was for 17 years a superintendent of nurses in a hospital in Northern China. Her last few years in China were under Japanese occupation. She was on furlough in the United States, when war broke out in 1941, but returned to China to work in the Baptist hospital in Wuchow which the Japanese had not yet taken over. She worked with the

Chinese until 1947, when she left again for the U.S., never to go back.
 In 1953, she was transferred in a Baptist clinic in Pusan. In 1964 she left Korea to return to South Carolina where she now lives.

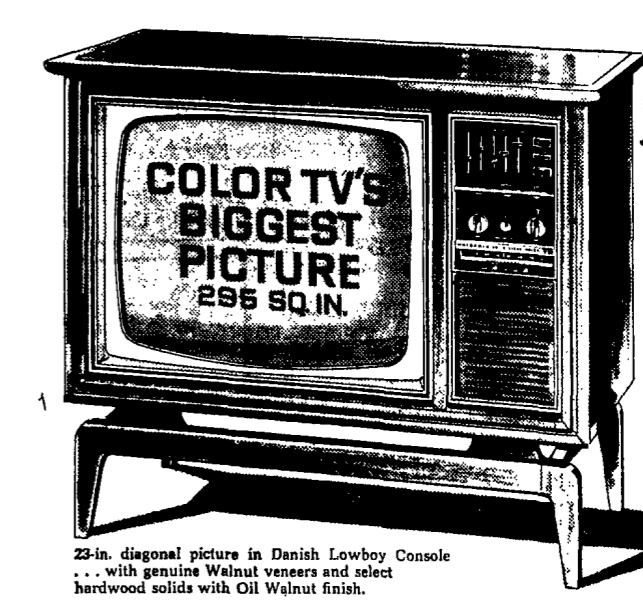
Fund Climbs To \$250,000

The Bishop's Fund 1967 Appeal this week reached the quarter of a million mark toward a \$300,000 goal.
 There are still several thousand visits unreported throughout the diocese, which will be received at the Bishop's Fund Office by the middle of the month.
 In releasing this figure of \$250,000, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Robert Arquet, diocesan fund director, commented: "We are extremely hopeful that our goal of \$300,000 will be reached, and perhaps exceeded this year. Last year on this same date, only \$225,000 had been reported, indicating the trend that in many parishes the appeal is running ahead of 1966."
