

Thomas F. Demo Dies, Third Accident Victim

Brasher Falls — Funeral services were held Saturday morning for Thomas F. Demo, 39, the third person to die as a result of a two-car accident Sept. 30.

He died in Montreal Neurological Institute Thursday night.

Services were in St. Patrick's Church with burial in St. Patrick's Cemetery. Arrangements were with the Hammill Funeral Home, Winthrop.

His mother, Mrs. John M. Demo, 59, and his wife, Mrs. Carol Carry Demo, 34, both were killed instantly in the accident. Double services for them were held last Thursday.

Two of Mr. Demo's sons, Cary, 14, and Thomas, Jr., 12, are still patients in Cornwall General Hospital with injuries sustained in the accident. Another son, Stephen, 2, was not in the family car which was en route to Expo '67 at the time of the accident.

Besides his three sons, Mr. Demo is survived by three brothers, John M., William D., and Richard C. Demo, all of Brasher Falls, and several aunts and uncles.

Mr. Demo was born in Massena Aug. 29, 1928, a son of John M. and Anna Patell Demo. He attended St. Mary's School in Massena and graduated from St. Joseph's Academy in Brasher Falls.

He married the former Carol Cary of Parishville Oct. 4, 1952, in Brasher Falls. They had since resided in Brasher Falls, where Mr. Demo owned and operated the Tri-Town Wholesale Supply Co.

He was a communicant of St. Patrick's Church, a member of Brasher Falls Council 2176, K. of C., the Tri-Town Motorcycle Club and the Tri-Town Chamber of Commerce.

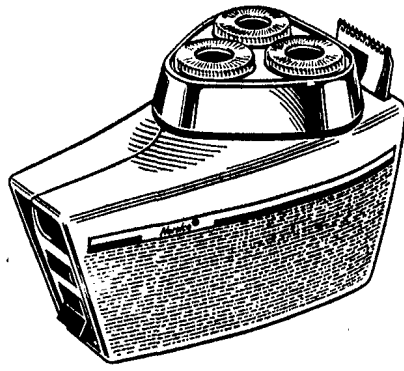

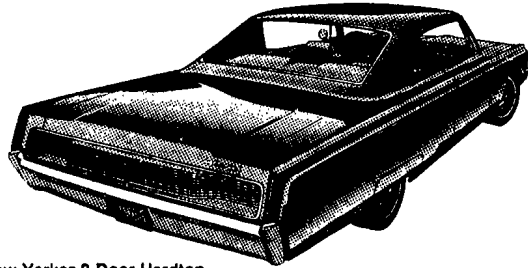

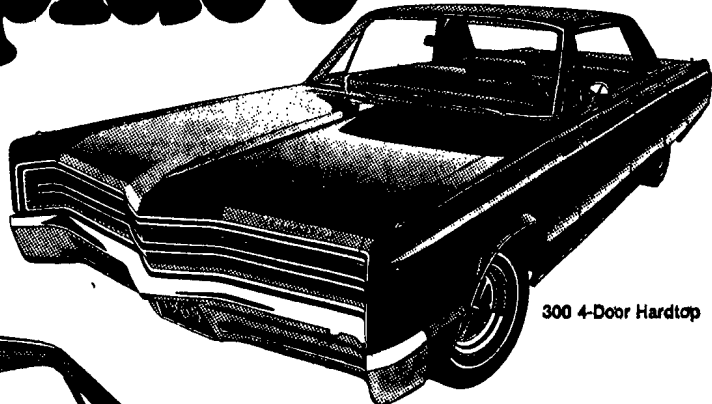
