Coffee break

A few weeks ago we ran a column on the regulations regarding the licensing and use of CB radio stations. Since then several CB'ers have asked about this again and about a related situation presently appearing in our area.

Licenses are issued by the FCC to an individual or to an association for the operation of a station. No licenses are issued to any individual for the operation of radios in general. The individual licensee of a station is responsible at all times for the operation of this station whether he is present or not. In the case of an individual, the station may be operated only by himself or by a member of his immediate family (wife, daughter, son, mother, etc.) actually living at the residence listed on the license. NO ONE ELSE can legally operate a radio used under that station license. You cannot let a friend transmit on your radio whether he uses your call sign or his. It makes no difference-

cannot use it. This is specifically stated in Section 87 of Part 95 which all CB'ers are required to have at the location designated on the license.

Also, Section 87 of Part 95 covers the use of stations licensed to incorporated groups of unincorporated associations. This section would apply to such groups as fraternities and sororities. Such associations may have a station license under 95.87 (b)(4) if they can show that individual licenses are not practical but communications under this type of license must be related to the business of the association. What this specifically means is that no group, such as a fraternity or sorority, can have a license which permits each and every member (or friends) to use a set as though it was licensed to him. Any transmissions under this license must be association business only, and not the personal communications of the members of the group. This means no idle chatter. In a college community such as Potsdam or Canton, the channels would become bedlam if such a practise were allowed.

If you do hear several individuals using a particular call sign and you know very well that these individuals are not of one family (it's not difficult to tell this), remember that it would be illegal for you to respond to them since the station would be operating illegally. The FCC has stated that in such cases they recommend completely ignoring the station involved. This not only protects you but also, if a station gets no response, it will soon go off the air.

We in the Potsdam area have one of the best CB'ing areas in the country. We were appalled at the constant rudeness of the CB'ers in Ogdensburg when we were there for the Festival Coffee Break. Many of the CB'ers in the area told us they had nearly given up CB because of those few who have made it impossible for the others to use their sets. Anyone traveling near a large city knows what the channels are like. Let's not allow that to happen to us here in Potsdam. Remember, common sense and a little bit of courtesy are the only things needed to have a CB community envied by the rest of the country. Don't do to others what you complain about yourself.

We were quite disturbed by reports that the Ogdensburg Festival Committee substituted a less expensive scanner for the one displayed at the sale of tickets for this item at the Coffee Break on July 31. The Standing Wave Radio Club, who set up the coffee break, had no part in the scanner drawing. This was conducted solely by and for the Festival Committee. We certainly hope that this committee sees fit to stand by the statements made by those selling the tickets for the raffle and award the winner the scanner all of us thought we were buying a ticket for. None of us like misrepresentation - especially by a city organization. Please, Ogdensburg, give the winner the prize he rightfully won!

This coming Sunday, August 15, will see the annual picnic of the Standing Wave Radio Club. It will be held at Norfolk Rod & Gun Club grounds in Norfolk starting early in the morning and running throughout the day. Doug Pete, president of the club, tells us that there should be a large number of CB'ers from around the country coming for this one since it was noted in many of the national CB magazines.

There will be prizes for everyone, with special attention given to the children of those attending. The kids will all be given several gifts during the day as well as all the free lemonade they can drink.

For the adults, there will be continual music, a 50-50 drawing every hour, many door prizes, and the big raffle drawing for the big prize.
