C-P and CSEA sign new pact

The Board of Education and the Civil Service Employees Association of the Colton-Pierrepont Central School District have agreed to a new one-year contract. Both parties reached agreement following a meeting with State-appointed mediator, Dr. Garnar V. Walsh of Potsdam.

The new contract will include a six percent across-the-board increase for all employees of the CSEA unit. The meal allowance will be increased from \$4.00 to \$5.00 per meal. Employees may also determine who to include under the term "immediate family" with respect to Bereavement Leave. One additional holiday was granted. This is to be

taken on two half-days, these being on December 24 and December 31.

Both parties agreed to a "letter of understanding" with respect to the workday, workweek. The parties will confer and examine any anticipated changes in the work hours of all employees before the changes are put into practice.

The new contract is retroactive to July 1, 1976 and will be in effect until June 30, 1977. Negotiators for the two parties were Mr. Peter Lively, BOCES and Mr. Thomas Dupe, CSEA Field Representative.

Allen Thomas, President of the Board of Education will greet the 75 employees in the auditorium and then they will break up into small group meetings with their respective administrators. Lunch will be served to all employees.

Search for early sports equipment

The Adirondack Museum at Blue Mountain Lake, New York, has begun planning for a permanent exhibition on early outdoor recreation in the Adirondacks. Opening in 1978 and provisionally titled "Woods and Waters," it will be a comprehensive display of camping, hiking, fishing and hunting activities in the Adirondacks in the nineteenth century. The Museum is interested in locating objects related to these activities, specifically:

1. Natural history specimens, particularly old collections of wild flowers, ferns and other flora, and collections of geological interest.
2. Indian objects relating to those Indians inhabiting the St. Lawrence, Lake George, Mohawk Valley, and central Adirondack regions, such as clothing, bows, arrows, camping gear.
3. Nineteenth century camping gear including hiking or wading boots, jackets, hats, mosquito netting, knapsacks, sleeping bags, cooking utensils, tents, and what are known as "India rubber" blankets. Any clothing, badges, licenses or equipment associated with an Adirondack guide.
4. Nineteenth century trout or cold water fishing gear such as flies, fly tying equipment, leaders, silk or gut lines, reels, rods, tackle boxes, creels. Warm water casting equipment including rods, reels, lines, lures and spinners by such makers as Lobb of Lake Placid and Buel of Whitehall. Well known early manufacturers of fishing tackle in the region were Fred D. Divine, a rod maker from Utica; John B. McHarg from Rome, who specialized in

tying flies; Yawman and Erbe, reel manufacturers from Rochester; and Loomis, Plumb Co., reel makers based in Syracuse in the 1880's.

The Museum would also like to find old photographs of any aspect of sport or recreation in the Adirondacks. According to Edward Comstock Jr., Associate Curator, the idea for the exhibit grew naturally from the Museum's theme, "Man's relationship to the Adirondacks."
