

CCT enrollments are 'on target'

A decade ago Clarkson College announced an enrollment projection of 3,000 undergraduate students by the mid-1970's. Clarkson College President Robert A. Plane today announced that the College is "right on target" as just over 3,000 undergraduate students have enrolled for the 1976-77 academic year. The Clarkson president also announced that new freshman number 724, very nearly the same as last year. A record

number of students transferred to Clarkson from other colleges and universities, 285. Thus there are 1,019 new students entering Clarkson this fall. Plane said that the College enrollment has reached the maximum. "It would be a shame," he said, "to think of Clarkson growing further. It would mean the loss of the personal atmosphere which characterizes the very best of the College." Because of the declining birth

rate, he cautioned that the college will have to work hard to maintain both enrollment and student quality at present high levels.

John Chapple, Dean of Admissions, Records, and Placement at Clarkson noted that the success in attracting outstanding students is in part due to the increased interest in professional careers in such areas as engineering, management, and science on the part of both men and women and the excellent opportunities for employment.

Chapple said that another reason for optimism is the "word-of-mouth" enthusiasm generated by present students which he credited to the very good morale and a high rate of academic success.

The usual indicators of student quality (national test results and class rank) point out that Clarkson reached the 3,000 undergraduate goal while attracting its best group of new students ever.



CLARKSON'S OLD MAIN-- Clarkson College President Robert A. Plane has announced that The Kresge Foundation of Troy, Michigan, has approved a \$100,000 challenge grant for the renovation of Old Main, the original Clarkson building. The grant is contingent upon the College's ability to raise the total amount of funding needed for this project. President Plane said, "We are extremely pleased with the Kresge Foundation challenge grant. It will be a great boost to our effort to obtain funding for the badly needed renovation of this fine building." Old Main housed the entire College at the time of its founding in 1896. Today, the classrooms, laboratories, and offices of the Department of Mechanical and Industrial Engineering are located there. Along with its historic significance, a main reason for preserving the building is that space is essential and renovation is considerably less costly than new construction. Particulars of a building so structurally sound. The planned renovation would also add approximately 5,845 square feet of usable space.

Religious education classes scheduled

Beatrice Aldrich, Principal of Religious Education at St. Mary's has sent a letter to all parents of school age children advising them of the schedule for the coming year. Please include the full name, grade, and birthdate of each child, and the names of both parents, their address, and phone number. Students will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. Parents will also have to sign the permission slips which will be sent to them by the public school, through the students. This will probably occur the first week of school. The schedule is as follows: Monday: 2:00-3:00-grades one, two and three. Tuesday: 1:00-2:00-grades six, seven and eight; 2:00-3:00-Grades four and five and Campus four, five and six.
