Helen Hosmer is honorary chairperson

Dr. Helen M. Hosmer, Dean Emeritus and Professor Emeritus of the Crane School of Music, is serving as the Honorary Chairwoman of the recently announced Celebrity Artist Series. Hosmer, now in retirement, has long been admired for her contributions to the field of music and her personal

commitment to enriching the cultural life of the region, as well as the world, as a representative on the U.S. Department of State International Panel, by visiting six countries in the Orient. Over the years, Hosmer was instrumental in bringing to the area the world's most noted composers, con-

ductors and performing artists. The new series, sponsored by the Associated Colleges of the St. Lawrence Valley, with financial assistance from the New York State Council on the Arts, is scheduled to further enrich the cultural life of the North Country. The series features performances by some of the finest classical concert artists in the world.

"It is a pleasure for me, said Hosmer, to support the establishment of this series. The international renown of such artists as Sarah Caldwell, Philippe Entremont, Ely Ameling, the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, Daniel and Machiko Kobalke, and organist Jean Langlais precedes their arrival. This array of talent should be heartily welcomed by all persons who appreciate excellence in music."

Performances in the series will largely be held in the concert hall at SUNY College at Potsdam dedicated to Dr. Hosmer.

In announcing Hosmer's affiliation with the series, Dr. Fritz Grupe, executive director of the Associated Colleges, comments, "Ms. Ruth Iogha, the faculty coordinator of the series, and I are pleased, indeed, to know that the caliber of musicianship contained in the Celebrity Artist Series is consistent with the high standards held by Dr. Hosmer. It is only through her past efforts that such a series is possible. Dr. Hosmer's interest in our effort to engage these outstanding artists is welcomed by all of the people who are looking forward to the fall season."

Alcoholic education bill draws Carey's signature

Legislation updating required instruction in all schools concerning the nature and effect of alcoholic drinks, drugs and tobacco has been signed into law by Governor Hugh Carey.

The approved bill repeals provisions of the Educational Law on subject, last amended in 1962, and substitutes a new section dealing with such health education.

A major thrust of the new instruction is toward, the development of desirable health behavior attitudes and knowledge, as well as self-reliance and problem-solving capacity.

Instruction at the elementary level will be by either regular classroom teachers or by teachers certified to teach health education. Only the latter will instruct at the junior high and senior high school level.

The Commissioner of Education is authorized to prescribe health education courses, including instruction regarding alcohol, tobacco, and drugs, contents of which need not be uniform throughout the state.

Pre-service training programs for elementary teachers are required to include preparation for instruction in alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs.

Student artist shows at Canton

He is currently a student in illustration at the Spectrum Institute in Somerville, New Jersey, having been awarded a grant from Greenfields Memorial Foundation of Montreal, Canada.

His summers are spent participating in the many art shows in the northeast. He participates in the Waterfowl Festival in Salisbury, Maryland and in the Atlantic Flyway Wild Fowl Carving and Arts Exhibition. He presented a one-man show in Skaneateles, New York, sponsored by the Audubon Society. His commissioned works include covers for

Cabel's Sporting Goods catalog and a cover for a national cat breeders magazine.

Quebec artist has show at SLN bank

An exhibition of the artwork of Walter W. Franke of Duvernay, Laval, Quebec, will be on display at the Ogdensburg office of The St. Lawrence National Bank from August 22 through September 9. The artwork is traveling through several of the bank's branches during the summer months. All items are for sale by the artist.

Occasionally during the show period, Franke will demonstrate art technique at a few of the branches. Dates and times will be announced.

Walter W. Franke was born in the Czechoslovakian Sudentenland in 1925, the son of a well-known German artist and teacher, and very early in life received an abundance of art guidance and encouragement. For two years he studied at the Dresden Art Academy and during the war he travelled Europe extensively, continually sketching and collecting impressions of different peoples and regional scenes.

From 1945 through 1947, Franke studied in the United States under the famous Professor Scott of Utah, and during this time he was commissioned to paint a number of large murals in various government buildings in Texas and Oregon. Returning to Europe in 1947, he continued his studies in Hanover and Desseldorf, painting and examining modern techniques and styles.

In 1955 he arrived with his family of seven children in Montreal, Quebec, and began painting that which he is best known for today, the Canadian landscape. He has been involved in numerous group shows over the years, and has held 27 one man shows across Canada and in eastern United States. His quaint old Montreal
