

Tanner comments on achievements of Stockholm Board

"Never before, in my memory, has there been such a good working relationship between our Town Board and the citizens of our town," said Edward Tanner, supervisor of the Town of Stockholm, in an interview recently. "Our two local fire companies and other organized groups including the Seaverton Tax Association, as well as many individuals, will attest to this," he said.

"Together we've worked to give the town the best services we can and still hold down expenses," he added. Tanner, a three-times supervisor, is concerned with the possibility of a near-complete changeover in officials. "This would be a tragic mistake," he said. "There should always be old

members on the Board when new ones come in. When I was first elected supervisor, I'd have been without the help of Silas Hunter, who was Superintendent of Highways at the time. He filled me in on countless details that would have taken me weeks to figure out by myself.

"I believe that change of officials is sometimes better, but not all at once," he continued, "now here in Stockholm our candidates include two new councilmen, two assessors, two justices, one town collector and Superintendent of Highways, as well as supervisor. State and federal aid is becoming more and more demanding in paper work, and there should be someone already in office who is acquainted with this to make it work faster and better for those coming in."

Tanner, who will again be running in the Primary, spoke of some of the town's accomplishments. "We instituted new bidding procedures in which we write our own specs to make it more competitive bidding, and in the last five or six years I'd say we've saved the taxpayers up to \$20,000."

He said that in past years all records had been kept in the Town Barn in storage space that had huge cracks that let moisture in. Slow destruction by mildew was a problem. "We put in a new vault here at the

Municipal Building and bought second-hand doors at a saving of about a third.

"By using our own help we put a new roof on the town garage for about half what we would have paid had it been done on contract.

"In making use of Anti-Recession money," he said, "we hired five Stockholm people who mainly cut miles and miles of brush along the roads, providing them with several months' work.

"We are studying several more projects that we want to go into if it doesn't hurt the taxpayers.

"And," he added, "this is the first time since I can remember that the Stockholm landfills met the New York State DOT standards."

Tanner said that they've showed that they encourage people to work with the Board. "All our meetings are open and we've had several informational meetings," he said, "to which special invitations were sent to all committee members of both parties."

As for this personal record Tanner said that in his 10 years as councilman, to his knowledge, he had missed only one and a half meetings. (He had to leave one meeting early.) He said that on the Board of Supervisors he had never missed or been late for a meeting and that included regular, special, committee and public meetings. A supervisors' job is becoming more

and more time-consuming," he said. "It increases by at least one-third every year, until once day it will have to become a full-time job."

He said he had answered every complaint, no matter how small, often taking another Board member with him. He said he investigates everything.

"I've worked to get the aged straightened out and give them a better understanding of their Social Security

and pensions," he said. "Town officers are never closed to anyone, and all meetings are open."
