We invite you to stop by the shelter and see some of our renovations or adopt a loveable pet. Bob, our hard-working shelter manager, has been teaching some of the many kittens and puppies at the shelter how to eat on their own in preparation for their finding a new home. Some people bring unweaned kittens and pups to the shelter. If old enough to eat on their own, Bob trains them. If not, they are humanely euthanized. We always prefer to get the mother animal too. That way we know for certain we won't be getting another batch of pups or kittens from her in a few months time because if she is adopted, she goes to a home where she must be spayed/neutered.

Every week after week the importance of neuter and spay and hope people will heed our advice. Most people don't realize how great the overpopulation problem is. They think, "I only have one dog or cat, so it won't hurt anything if we just have a litter or two. Besides it would be wonderful for the kids to 'experience' a batch of cute little kittens or puppies."

The problem with this thinking is that everyone else is thinking this way too. So at the same time you are having a litter, your neighbor down the block is also "littering," or your sister-in-law or your best friend and so on. What happens to all these pups and kittens? The ideal thing which should happen is that a pup or kitten is adopted by a loving, responsible family who will provide it with proper care, including neuter-spays BEFORE the animal produces any kittens or pups. Unfortunately, the "ideal" does not happen as often as we would like. Homes are few and far between and most pet owners will give away their animals to anyone who comes along.

Many people who read this column are already good pet owners who can do all animals a favor by "preaching" the importance of neuter-spays. Good pet owners can talk to their friends and neighbors about the many myths associated with neuter-spays, give the Potsdam Humane Society lower cost neuter-spays phone number (353-8868) for those in financial need, or offer to assist in taking the pet to be spayed/neutered, if transportation is a problem.

Every week we hear the gamut of old wives' tales and false beliefs about cats and dogs. Just today, I was told that a nursing female cat cannot get pregnant (FALSE—a female cat can get pregnant again in 3-10 days after delivery), a dog will go into heat if she changes households (False—if that happens at all, it is probably just a coincidence).

Everhart seeks council seat

Kenneth Everhart, a candidate for Republican Town Councilman in the Town of Stockholm, for the September 8 Primary Election, is 31 years of age, and moved to the West Stockholm area with his parents in 1953. He now resides with his wife, and son of a few miles out of West Stockholm on the Pearl Bridge Road.

He attended the local West Stockholm School and then went to the Potsdam High School where he graduated in 1963.

He graduated from Canton ATC in 1966 with a degree in Agriculture. He served in the U.S. Army from 1967 through 1969 and was stationed in the Panama Canal Zone as a Radio Teletype Operator and attained the rank of Sergeant.

After spending a few years in California, he returned to Stockholm selling heavy duty road and construction machinery. Currently he is a member of the West Stockholm Fire Department.

Edward Long dead at 90

Funeral services for Edward Long, 90, of Colton, were held Tuesday, August 23 at St. Patrick's Church in Colton, with the Reverend John Kennehan officiating. Burial was in St. Mary's Cemetery in Potsdam.

Edward Long died August 21 at Potsdam Hospital. Surviving are a son, Russel of Potsdam, two grandchildren and several nephews, nieces and cousins.

He was born in County Cork Ireland, August 24, 1886, the son of Edward and Katherine Regan Long. He came to the United States at the age of seven. In 1916 he was married to the former Blanche LeBeef, who died in 1946. He was a steamfitter for the Racquette River Paper Company until his retirement in 1955.

Everhart feels that his association with the many Town Boards in St. Lawrence and Franklin Counties has given him an insight on how these Town Boards operate, especially regarding the Highway Department, and makes him qualified for the position of Town Councilman.
