The regular meeting of the Norfolk Town Board will be held Monday night, September 12, at the Norfolk Town Hall at 7 p.m.

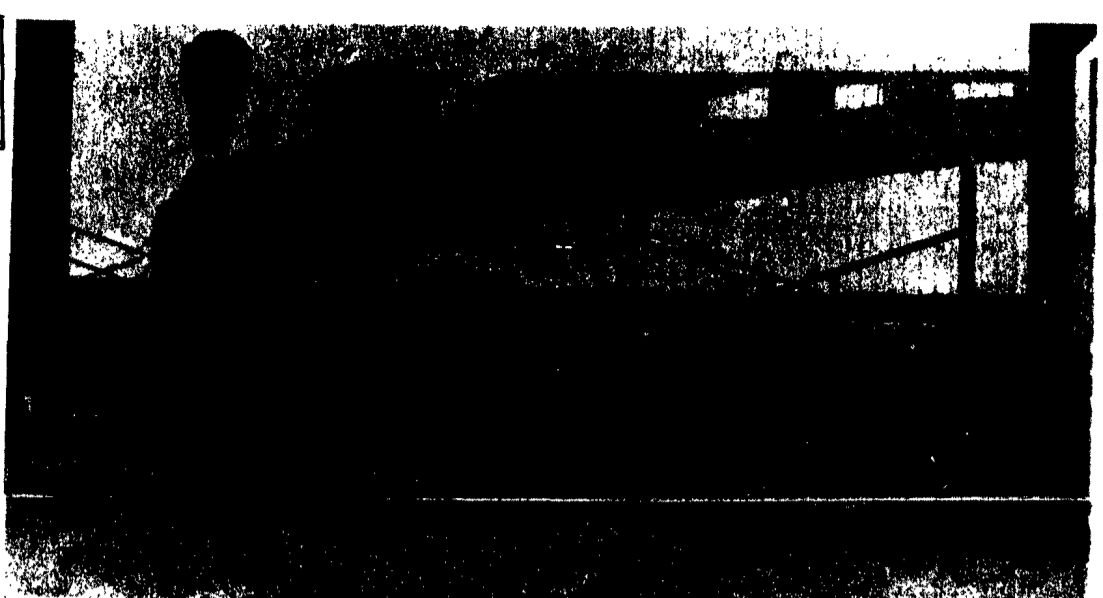
MD HORSE-A-THON
