

ROBI enrollment open for fall

Applications are still being taken for the new fall term which is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, September 7, at Roethel's Ogdensburg Business Institute.

Adults wishing to continue their education, as well as high school graduates, still have time to apply for student loans and scholarship incentive awards. ROBI is approved by the New York State Education Department for the training of Veterans and those eligible for Rehabilitation. ROBI is also approved by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare making Social Security Benefits available to eligible students.

Special opportunity classes for the non high school graduate, part-time student, or working adult will continue on an open door policy. High School equivalency diplomas may be earned at Roethel's by enrolling in any of the following business programs: Management, General Business, Secretarial Science, Medical, Legal, Executive, Junior Accounting, or Court Reporting.

CETA recruits vets

The St. Lawrence County Employment and Training Department is increasing its efforts to assist recently separated veterans through Title II of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA). It was recently announced by Allen J. Rische, Chairman, Service Offices in Ogdensburg or Massena.

Through CETA Title II the county operates a Public Service Employment (PSE) program which provides transitional employment opportunities to unemployed and underemployed individuals in job slots which provide needed public services.

The Employment and Training Department will be recruiting for veterans to fill ten special job slots. Applicants will be assessed by a variety of means for the opportunity to have a job slot developed which reflects the individual's employment and educational history. Classroom training opportunities in job-related coursework will also be available for the individuals selected.

Any veteran interested in the ten available openings in this opportunity should contact Gary E. Krolkoski, Senior Coordinator of the CETA Title II program, at the CETA office, Canton. Applicants must be actively registered with the New York State Employment Service offices in Ogdensburg or Massena.

Vets eligible for work study help

Full-time veteran students who foresee money problems at fall enrollment time should look into the Veterans Administration's work-study program.

Administrator of Veterans Affairs Max Cleland said that the new GI Bill payment procedures might leave students who don't have savings from summer jobs in a bind to pay necessary enrollment and subsistence expenses.

To help offset this financial headache he said he has directed that more VA work-study jobs be made available.

GI Bill students can work up to 250 hours per semester for VA and receive \$2.50 per hour in addition to their usual education assistance allowances.

An advance of up to \$250 is available as soon as the employment agreement is processed. The advance covers the first 100 hours of work.

Jobs are available for VA-related work on a given campus or at a VA facility.

Priority is established on the basis of service-connected disability, financial need, motivation and the nature of the work.

After the first 100 hours of work, VA pays work-study students after each 50 hours of work.

Details are available from campus veterans counselors or at any VA office.
