Clarkson announces fall sports schedule

The Clarkson College baseball, cross-country, golf, soccer, and women's volleyball teams will open the fall season in the next few weeks.

The fall schedule was announced today by F. William Fiesinger, director of athletics.

Coach Jack Phillips' baseball team will open the schedule on the road with a twin bill at Norwich University, Saturday, September 10. The slate includes eight double-headers.

Phillips will also coach the cross-country team, which will begin the season at Geneseo State, Saturday, September 17.

The meet will also include Binghamton. The golf team, under John Serwatka, will tee off at Elmira, September 9, and 10.
