ANointING OF SICK

On Sunday, September 25, St. Francis of Assisi Church and Newman Center, Main Street, will be the site of the annual communal anointing of the sick for parishioners of St. Francis' and St. Mary's churches in Potsdam. The ceremony, scheduled for 2 p.m. will include a special Votive Mass for the Sick, with individual reception of the Sacrament of the Sick following the homily. Those facing surgery or hospitalization, the elderly, those afflicted with chronic illnesses of a physical or emotional nature, and the handicapped are among those invited to receive the Sacrament.

This will be the fourth year in which the communal anointing ceremony has been held in Potsdam. St. Francis Church was chosen as the site because its lack of steps facilitates entry for those requiring assistance. Doctors and nurses will be present to help those attending.
