VILLAGE DOG ORDINANCE
We would like to remind Potsdam residents that the Village of Potsdam has a dog ordinance. Your dog will be picked up by the dog warden, if the dog is running free on the streets within the village. Your dog should be on a leash or attended by a person of adequate age and able to control the dog.

When your dog is picked up it is taken to the Potsdam Animal Shelter on Madrid Avenue. Owners will be charged a fine of up to \$10.00 for the first violation of the ordinance, and a minimum penalty of \$10.00 for the second. Owners will also be charged a \$3.00 a day charge by the animal shelter for room and board. It is much easier to keep your dog on a leash, in a fenced yard, or on a chain run.

LOWER-COST NEUTER SPAY PROGRAM.
The Potsdam Humane Society has a lower-cost neuter-spay program for people who have a financial need. Please do not try to take advantage of us

and this program. We are happy to talk with anyone who wants to have their animal neutered or spayed and does not have financial need, but we are responsible to the participating veterinarians and we do not want the program jeopardized. If we take you at your word, that you have a financial need, and you drive to the veterinarian's office in a new Cadillac, on your way to the local country club to play golf, it would seem that you could afford to have your animal neutered or spayed at the regular fee. One added thought, the regular fee for spaying or neutering is a bargain in this part of the country. If you were living in a more populated area, the fees could be more than double what they are here.

Measaw rites held

Funeral services for F. Stanley Measaw, 78, of Plaza Mobile Court, Bradenton, Florida, were held Friday September 9, at the Nichols Funeral Home, Ogdensburg, and at Notre Dame Church. Burial was in Notre Dame Cemetery.

Measaw died on Monday, September 5, 1977 in Manatee Convalescent Center in Bradenton. He had been a resident of Manatee for some time.

Surviving are a son, F. Stanley Jr. of Toledo, Ohio; two daughters, Patricia M. Barr of Bradenton, and Elizabeth Furr of Yardville, New Jersey; two sisters, Pauline Sholette of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and Bessie Kolb of Sun City, California, a brother, William of Tacoma, Washington, 11 grandchildren, five great-grandchildren and several nephews and nieces. A brother, Gilbert, predeceased him. He was born in Ogdensburg, April 11, 1899, the son of Napoleon and Julia Daniels Measaw. He was married to the former Elizabeth Murray in Notre Dame Church on December 29, 1926. She died December 6, 1968.

Measaw was employed by Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation in the Potsdam area as a technician for over 50 years. He moved to Bradenton in 1974. He was a member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Bradenton and of the Knights of Columbus there. He was also a member of the Potsdam K of C.

Helping Hand now in Potsdam

The United Way of St. Lawrence County has signed a contract with the St. Lawrence County Community Services Board to implement a county-wide, 24 hour a day crisis intervention service for the residents of St. Lawrence County. The United Way's \$11,020, matched by the Department of Mental Hygiene, will help to improve the present capacity of the United Way's "Helping Hand" to achieve a Mental Health Emergency Service in concert with St. Lawrence County Mental Health Services.

The Helping Hand is set up to screen out the serious from not so serious calls and to handle crises by person-to-person contacts, via the telephone, and if the crisis is of such a nature where a person may be dangerous to himself or to

others, the situation will be referred to the person on call at the Community Mental Health Services who will make disposition of the case. In instances where the crisis is proximate to the St. Lawrence Psychiatric Center, and it is felt that the person needs inpatient treatment, referrals of course will be made directly to the St. Lawrence Psychiatric Center.

Helping Hand exists so that any person in St. Lawrence County who feels they have a problem can call 265-2700 collect, 24 hours a day, anonymously and confidentially, and talk about the problem. The person answering the Helping Hand phone will then try to provide the various alternatives to the problem and make a proper referral to the service or agency that can best alleviate or eliminate that problem in a way that is comfortable to the particular client.

As of September 9, 1977 the Helping Hand has moved to Potsdam and their new number is 265-2700 collect from within St. Lawrence County, 24 hours a day.
