Fletcher Named To Clarkson Post

Joseph A. Fletcher has been named career counselor in Clarkson's Career Planning and Placement Center. The center, under the direction of Kathryn Briggs Johnson, coordinates the campus visits of over 500 corporate and government recruits who conduct over 6,000 job interviews with Clarkson students. In addition the center provides career counseling, career development workshop and serves as an information source about post-college employment and graduate study.

In his new position, Fletcher's responsibilities will include coordinating career development programs such as individual workshops and group workshops, promoting outreach activities, developing resource materials for the career center, and assisting the director in placement activities.

Fletcher is a native of Camp Hill, Pa. He received his B.A. degree in psychology from Lycoming College in Williamsport, Pa., his M.S. in counseling and Student Personnel Services at SUNY at Albany; and he earned an Educational Specialist Certificate in counseling and student personnel services at SUNY at Albany.

Prior to his Clarkson appointment, he served as assistant coordinator of career services and placement at Elmira College. Ronald Ludman, formerly career counselor at Clarkson, is now at Emerson College in Boston, Mass. as career counselor.

Clarkson Grad Gets Tau Beta Pi Fellowship

William E. VanWagenen, Jr., a 1978 Clarkson civil and environmental engineering graduate, has been awarded a graduate fellowship by Tau Beta Pi, the national engineering honor society.

VanWagenen was one of the 18 winners chosen by the National Fellowship Board from 225 Tau Beta Pi members who applied this year. All fellowships are awarded on the competitive basis of high scholarship, campus leadership and service, promise of future development in the engineering profession, and need for financial assistance in graduate work.

VanWagenen plans to enter Georgetown University Law School in September. While in his three-year course of study for a law degree, he intends to concentrate in the areas of highway law, environmental law with special emphasis on air and water pollution, and patent law. His career goal is to work as a legal consultant for a state transportation department, a lawyer specializing in environmental issues, or as a patent lawyer for a large corporation.

He was Tau Beta Pi's New York Theta chapter president for 1977-78, a member of the Dean's Advisory Council, Phi Kappa Phi member, vice president of St. Francis of Assisi Newman Center Parish Council, and a member of Phi Alpha, Clarkson's honorary leadership society. He was also active in junior varsity and varsity intercollegiate soccer. VanWagenen is a native of Poughkeepsie, N.Y.
