## Dr. Donald Horowitz Is Speaker At SUNY Conference

Dr. Donald L. Horowitz, senior fellow in the Smithsonian Institution's Research Institute on Immigration and Ethnic Studies, will be the keynote speaker for State University College at Potsdam's 21st annual Social Studies conference, which starts Aug. 13. The conference theme is "Ethnicity: Changing Relations in Today's World." Dr. Horowitz's address at 7:30 p.m. Aug. 13 will deal with "Ethnicity, Conflict and Peace."  
 Horowitz is a graduate of Syracuse University and that University's Law School and holds L.L.M., M.A., and Ph.D. degrees from Harvard University. He has been at the Smithsonian Institution since 1975, having been a research associate at the Brookings Institution for three years previously. He has also been a fellow of the Council on Foreign Relations and Woodrow Wilson International Center

for Scholars, an attorney with the Department of Justice and a research associate with Harvard's Center for International Affairs.  
 A member of the editorial board of the journal, "Ethnicity," Dr. Horowitz has written numerous articles on ethnic topics in a variety of publications. From Aug. 13 through Aug. 18, the conference will feature numerous consultants from various colleges and universities, the State Education Department, the Canadian Education and the U.S. State Department.  
 Among topics to be covered are Ethnicity in the Soviet Union, Cultural Movements and Ethnic Conflict, Ethnicity: Culture and Power, Canadian Unity, Nationalism in China, Ethnic Groups among the Arabs, Ethnicity in America: An Historical Perspective, The British Experience, Regional Autonomy and Ethnic Groups in

Yugoslavia, Ethnicity in Latin America, Africa, India and more.
