

## 'Back To Pierrepont Day'

PIERREPONT—"Back to Pierrepont Day" is nothing new. It has been celebrated for many years under the guidance of Ruth Clark, veteran president of the Community Club, and in cooperation with the Union Church. However, this year there is something new. They are joined by the very new Pierrepont Historical Society.

The three groups have combined to make this year's celebration, set for Aug. 20, a full day of activity. First, there will be a 10 a.m. service in the historic little church for any interested person. This little institution is fighting for survival. Built in 1884 and for many years very active, now it is open only in the summer and is beginning to need repair. As a religious landmark and as a historical site, it is important to the town.

At 11 a.m., Town Supervisor Larry Scanlon and Orin Thomas will preside over dedication ceremonies of the newly-acquired museum. A great deal of renovation has been done, and historical society members have planned more. A collection of memorabilia is on display. Immediately following the dedication, a covered dish luncheon will be served in the basement of the Town Hall. The Community Club and Historical Society are furnishing beverages, rolls and butter. Please bring your own table service and a dish to pass.

The last event of the day will be a program featuring local talent. There

will also be a slide program put together by the St. Lawrence County Historical Society and the St. Lawrence Historical Association. Included will be slides taken for the Planning Board of historic sights in Pierrepont.

The Historical Society is in the process of compiling a history of Pierrepont. Anyone with material that will help them present a truer picture of the town-past and present-is asked to please bring the information on Aug. 20. The latest county history was written in 1894 and there was very little about Pierrepont in that. A lot has happened in 85 years and there are many gaps to fill. A few chapters will be available for inspection.

The public is invited to enjoy a day of fun, fellowship, and visiting in historic Pierrepont Center.

## Seniors Hear Speaker Outline Challenge

Mrs. Rhea Eckel Clark, a graduate of the former Potsdam Normal and currently vice president of the National Council of the Aging, addressed the approximately 200 retired teachers, their spouses and friends who attended the annual spring meeting and luncheon of the Northern Zone Retired Teachers Association at SUC, Potsdam.

In the absence of President Charles J. Murphy, Merton L. Van Sant, Gouverneur, zone vice president, conducted the meeting. Following the reports of officers and committee chairmen for the zone, A.A. Kingston, Potsdam, outlined the plans for the annual leadership conference sponsored by the New York State Retired Teachers Association.

After the business meeting, Van Sant introduced Clark and her challenging topic, "What's Ahead." She made three very important points: the need for government to help those senior citizens who really cannot help themselves, the need to change the general attitude toward senior citizens and the need for senior citizens to become involved in all kinds of worthwhile activities. She concluded her remarks by saying, "It is better to be 70 years young than to be 40 years old."

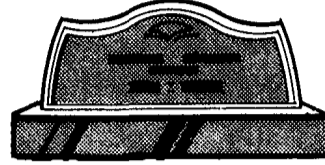
Concluding the day's activities, Roy Kennedy, assistant director of housing, Lake Placid Olympic Organizing Committee, presented an interesting and informative report on the plans for staging the winter Olympics in 1980 at

Lake Placid. He outlined some of the problems facing the committees and showed slides of work being done on outdoor and indoor sites.

Van Sant, who is chairman of membership in the New York State Retired Teachers Association, Northern Zone, reported a 1977-78 membership of 966 retired teachers and their spouses. According to an amendment to the by-laws of the state association, as of October, 1977, any active teacher who is at least 55 years of age and who has taught at least 10 years in New York

State can also be a member. Van Sant pledged the help of the other officers and himself in answering any questions on the 1978-79 membership. Other officers are Charles J.
