Folklife Festival Features Fiddler

Charlie Anderson of Rensselaer Falls will be one of the featured performers in the daytime fiddle workshop at the Festival of North Country Folklife to be held on Sept. 20 on the Canton ATC Campus.

Anderson is the festival's representative of Scottish-style fiddling. He and his father and brother have fiddled together since his youth, and many of the tunes he plays today are his own creations or those of his brother. He has one special tune in which he succeeds in making his fiddle sound exactly like the Scottish bagpipes!

Anderson will be joined in the workshop by Don LaBarge of Canton, Howard Woodcock of Rensselaer Falls, and Barbara Day of Madrid. Other daytime workshops will focus on percussion instruments, the limberjack, banjo styles, square dance call and the City of Brockville Pipe Band. In addition to these musical events, the festival will feature the demon-

stration and sale of traditional crafts and food. A working moonshine still and an old-time country auction by John Beswick of Bucks Bridge will also be included in the daytime activities. The day's events, which will be free to the public, will be followed by an evening concert. Admission to the concert will be \$1.75. An outdoor, bring-your-own picnic supper will be held on the grounds from 5-9 p.m.

The festival is sponsored by the Center for the Study of North Country Folklife, a research unit recently established at SUNY ATC in Canton. The center exists to collect, record study and analyze the many traditional ways of life, past and present, in the northernmost counties of the state. The Festival of North Country Folklife is the culmination of a one-year project by the center focusing on 20th century folkways. Seven Springs Is Site Of Fiddlers' Fet Festival

Because of the unprecedented response at their first fiddlers festival, the Association of North Country Fiddlers has announced that it will again stage another fiddlers' festival. The festival will be held Sept. 10 at the Clarkson College Seven Springs Ski Area located near Parishville.

The Fiddle Festival is an open-air event. Not a contest where fiddlers vie against one another for a prize, a fiddler festival is a gathering of all the fiddlers in an area to play, swap tunes, and have a good time.

In addition to fiddlers, there are the accompanying instruments; banjo, guitar, bass and accordion. Impromptu bands are the order of the day, as musicians for miles around gather to visit and play together.

The festival last year was a huge success and featured the New York State fiddle champion, step dancers and fiddlers from Canada, bluegrass music, and spontaneous dancing by the crowd in front of the stage. Plenty of food and drink will again be available at the festival site and at reasonable prices. Music gets underway at 10 a.m. and continues non-stop throughout the day until 7 or 8 p.m. in the evening.

The Association of North Country Fiddlers plans to make this year's festival even bigger and better than last year's. Invitations will go out to every fiddler in the North Country and liaison has been established a similar group representing fiddlers in Canada. It is hoped that a good turnout of fiddlers from across the border will participate.

In addition it is expected that a number of fiddlers from the southern area representing the State fiddlers association will come up for the festival including the recently-crowned state champion, Hal Casey of North Syracuse as well as Don Perkins of Lake Placid, and Bob Vallee of Valleyfield, Quebec, second and third place winners. Wyants Participate In Museum Workshop

Area residents are invited to attend a comprehensive Exhibit Design Workshop on Sept. 11, at the St. Lawrence County Historical Association Silas Wright Museum, Canton.

This workshop is designed as a hands on learning program. Under the supervision of Kevan Moss, exhibition director, Gallery Association of New York State, Inc., Hamilton, N.Y., participants will learn basic display techniques by arranging objects themselves. Those attending will also learn how to research an exhibit and will prepare exhibit scripts.

During the 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. workshop, Kay and Robert Wyant of the Potsdam Museum, will teach the audience how to construct low cost display cases and mounting blocks for exhibit use.

The workshop is sponsored by the Regional Conference of Historical Agencies, Manlius, N.Y. and the St. Lawrence County Historical Association. RCHA, an educational organization, provides free guidance and technical assistance to historical societies, museums, preservation agencies, related institutions and historians in 23 counties in upstate New York.

Donnie Woodcock of Rensselaer Falls last year's state fiddle champion and local favorite in the North Country, as well as his father Howard, is expected to play.

The Fiddlers' Festival is the only event of this kind in the entire North Country and indications are that this festival is gaining wide recognition and acclaim as an attraction of growing importance in the area.

For those who have never attended a festival of this nature, it is a most en-

joyable type of entertainment. There is something about good old time fiddle music that is stimulating and lively.

A festival such as this is a great opportunity for an entire family to attend, enjoy the music and friendly atmosphere, eat, wander around, meet old friends, make new friends, and listen to the musicians. A good idea is to bring blankets or lawn chairs if one intends to stay the entire day, and most people do.

The festival is expected to become a permanent part of North Country musical tradition as it grows in importance.

An added feature at this year's festival will be the expected participation of bluegrass groups.

Bluegrass is an ever-growing popular type of country music and fans are increasing across the country.

The Fiddlers Festival is held rain or shine. Perlman, Ameling, Bolet Highlight Celebrity Artist Series In Potsdam

Violinist Itzhak Perlman, soprano Eily Ameling and pianist Jorge Bolet are the featured artists for the fall season of the Celebrity Artist Series sponsored by the Associated Colleges of the St. Lawrence Valley. Perlman will appear in concert in Potsdam on Oct. 5, Ameling on Oct. 29 and Bolet on Nov. 29.

Perlman, although still very young, is considered the foremost violinist of his generation. In 1964, Perlman won the Leventritt Memorial Award which led to appearances with the New York Philharmonic and other major American orchestras. In addition

to his orchestral performances, Perlman has performed in recital in every major American city, as well as in Europe, Australia, the Far East and South America.

Ameling was born in Rotterdam, Holland. Her career began when she won first prize at the Concours International de Musique in Geneva. Ameling has appeared throughout Europe, performing with the Berlin Philharmonic, Concertgebouw and Philharmonic Orchestras, BBC Symphony, English Chamber Orchestra and

the Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields. This "first lady of lieder" and her pianist, Dalton Baldwin, will present a varied program of lieder. Her appearance in Potsdam is the second in as many years.

Bolet "One of the few living superpianists," and "he is an orchestra at the piano," are just two of the many comments in praise of Jorge Bolet. Bolet began piano studies in his native Cuba at age five and became a student at Philadelphia's Curtis Institute of Music when he was 12. He graduated in 1934 with top honors and was the first recipient of the Josef Hofman Award in 1937. Since then Bolet has performed with the world's major orchestra and conductors and played in every musical capital.

All performances will be at Helen Hosmer Hall, SUNY Potsdam, and with the exception of the Oct. 5 performance which begins at 8:15 p.m., all concerts start at 8 p.m. Season tickets are \$8.50 for students and senior citizens, and \$11.50 for the general public.
