## Aging Office, SLU Combine On Workshop

CANTON-An institute for studies in gerontology will be sponsored by St. Lawrence University in conjunction with the St. Lawrence County office for the Aging Sept. 6 through 8.

The three-day workshop is designed for persons working with or interested in the aging, and is under the direction of Mrs. Mary Jean Panella, associate professor of social work at St. Lawrence, assisted by James Forrest of the County Office of the Aging. The practitioner oriented institute will be held at the Wawbeek Inn on Route 30, one mile north of Route 3, east of Tupper Lake.

Topics for discussion will include drug abuse in the elderly, statewide senior action council, physical fitness and exercise, elderly in today's society, nutrition for the elderly, minority elderly, handicapped elderly, volunteer services, information and referral systems and services.

The pre-registration fee for the September institute is \$10 for the three-day session. For persons who wish to attend just part of the institute, the charge is \$5 per day. Room and board is available at the Wawbeek Inn for an additional charge.
