The Village of Potsdam proposes to request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) from the Village's 000 Urban Renewal Parcel No. 15 will be acquired and disposed of to the project sponsor. Necessary public improvements (street, parking, water and sewer) will be provided with grant funds.

1. SANDSTONER ELDERLY HOUSING AND SUPPORTING IMPROVEMENTS-\$81,000 Urban Renewal Parcel No. 15 will be acquired and disposed of to the project sponsor. Necessary public improvements (street, parking, water and sewer) will be provided with grant funds.

2. LAWRENCE AVENUE HOUSING AND SUPPORTING IMPROVEMENTS-\$35,000 Drainage improvements and sidewalk will be provided along Lawrence Avenue to the project site.

3. NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT AND REDEVELOPMENT-\$284,000 A program of Housing Rehabilitation, Acquisition Relocation and Clearance, and Public Improvements will be undertaken within the Village's Housing Rehabilitation area; i.e., that area west of Market Street.

4. CONTINGENCY-LOCAL COOPERATIVE HOUSING, 000 Contingency funds will be used only for eligible Community Development Block Grant projects. The remaining activity, Program Administration, \$50,000, is exempt from environmental review.

OPEN LETTER FROM ADMINISTRATOR
A. BARTON HEPBURN HOSPITAL

TO: All Blue Cross-Blue Shield Subscribers

A. Barton Hepburn Hospital has notified Blue Cross-Blue Shield of its intention to discontinue our provider contract as of February 15, 1979.

This action was necessitated because of the State mandated reimbursement formula that has required Hospital plan of Utica (Blue Cross) to reimburse A. Barton Hepburn Hospital at a rate considerably below our actual costs.

Understandably this will raise a number of questions in the minds of Blue Cross subscribers utilizing the services of our hospital. In an attempt to clarify the situation we have listed below the most frequently asked questions and also have given you the appropriate and corresponding answer.

1. Question-Will the A. Barton Hepburn Hospital continue to provide care for patients who have Blue Cross Insurance?
Answer-Yes. Patient care and doctor-patient relationships are, in no way, affected by this action.

2. Question-Does this mean that patients with Blue Cross Subscriber Contracts no longer have hospital and/or medical coverage?
Answer-No. The primary difference lies in the fact that after February 15, 1979, Blue Cross will send the reimbursement check directly to the patient, rather than the Hospital. The check may then be endorsed "Payable to A. Barton Hepburn Hospital" and delivered or mailed immediately to the Hospital.

3. Question-How will Blue Cross know about a patient's Hospital bill?
Answer-The Hospital Business Office will continue to bill the Blue Cross Plan for the patient in the same manner as in the past.

4. Question-Under this arrangement, what will the Blue Cross Benefits cover?
Answer-Blue Cross has forwarded a letter to a number of Blue Cross Group Administrators in the area, outlining their coverages. The pertinent portion reads as follows: "Allowances for services in a non-member hospital may vary by contract. Noted below are the various program designations and the benefits that will be paid to you should you seek covered services at A. Barton Hepburn Hospital."

5. Question-How much will I owe the Hospital?
Answer-The entire Hospital bill is due and payable at the time of discharge. However, the Hospital will take into consideration the fact that the patient will not be reimbursed by Blue Cross for approximately 30 days.

6. Question-If I have questions with regards to my Blue Cross coverage, whom do I contact?
Answer-Blue Cross has requested that all questions regarding coverage under individual or group contracts be referred to Claims-Hospital Plan, Inc., Utica, New York 13502. Telephone (315) 798-4200.

7. Question-To whom may I direct questions at A. Barton Hepburn Hospital regarding this matter?
Answer-Questions may be directed to the Hospital Business Office. In addition, if you wish to discuss the reasons why the Hospital Board of Trustees deemed it necessary to take this action, John W. Symons, Administrator will be happy to discuss this with a Blue Cross Subscriber or a Blue Cross Group Administrator.

8. Question-Will this affect my Medicare Part A coverage?
Answer-No. Blue Cross of Utica has indicated that there will be no change with respect to Medicare coverage.

Outpatient services will be paid for as before—no difference.

As of February 15, 1979 Blue Cross-Blue Shield will no longer send payments to this Hospital nor will assignments be permitted. In every instance payments will be sent to your home or other designated location. Upon receipt of this payment it may be endorsed "Payable to A. Barton Hepburn Hospital" and delivered or mailed immediately to the Hospital.
