

Zappia Shatters Taylor's College Mark

Clarkson's Kevin Zappia only scored one goal in last night's (Monday) 6-4 Clarkson win over the University of Vermont, but chances are he's not the least bit worried about getting only one goal since it was just enough to break the college scoring record held previously by former Clarkson All-American Dave Taylor.

The lone goal-Zappia's 99th-came with 7:34 left in the second period. He scored off a rebound from Jay Wescott's slap shot from the blue line.

It turned out to be a doubly fortunate evening for Clarkson's Wescott. Not only did he set up Zappia's record-breaking goal, but he also landed honors for himself by scoring three assists, therefore becoming only the second defenseman in Clarkson history to ever score 100 career points.

Zappia also came up with one assist in the game.

Clarkson is now in fourth place in ECAC competition. Its overall record is 17-9, and in the ECAC, Clarkson is now

11-7.

Also this week, Zappia was named Division I forward of the week by the ECAC in its tenth weekly hockey report. Zappia was cited for his hat-trick performances when Clarkson downed Colgate University 8-5 and R.P.I. 10-4.

Zappia is in his fourth year, as a forward on the Clarkson squad.

He had tied Taylor's record by scoring his 98th career goal when he lead the Golden Knights to victory against R.P.I. Saturday night.

Taylor is now with the Los Angeles Kings of the NHL.

Zappia had entered the R.P.I. contest with 95 redlighters, but he quickly hit for two goals in the second period before earning the hat trick with just four seconds remaining in regulation time.

His hat-trick in that game set the stage for his dramatic record-breaker Monday night.

Zappia, a senior social science major, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Zappia, 53 Churchill Ave., Massena.

Norton, King and Valade. Do those names sound familiar? They should.

Bill Norton, Jack King and John Valade are three seniors who have consistently come up with goals for the Potsdam Central hockey team, which is now facing post-season sectional competition.

The three seniors lead the Potsdam club in scoring. And more often than not, you'll find one of them working to assist the other.

Together, the three have racked up 105 points. Norton leads with 39 of those points, King is next with 38 and Valade has 28.

Although this year is the first time all three have teamed up on the line, it's hardly the first time they have played together.

Off and on since they were in fifth grade, the trio has played on the same hockey teams.

"I think we know where each of us are on the ice," Norton said.

By this point, each seems to know best how to work with the others.

For example, Valade explained that "Billy goes better outside. I stay behind him and get something off the boards."

Due largely to the trio's efforts, the team has finally broken a six-game losing streak by downing a tough Gloucester team 8-5 last Saturday.

It's been an up and down year for the Potsdam icemen. Things started off poorly with defeats in the first two games of the season. But a win over Saranac Lake in the third game started a seven-game winning streak.

Then, with everything seemingly under control, the icemen fell into the slump they finally broke out of last weekend.

One adjustment they have made to help bring on some wins is to switch captain Mike Sullivan to right wing, and put Dan Dorothy in at center.

Viewing the season as a whole, Egan had praise for the work of his team.

"I think it's been a successful season," he said. "It could have been a little better, winning-wise, but I think this was a hard-working team."

Besides the efforts of Norton, Valade and King, Egan also had good words for others on the team.

"We're fortunate to have two goal

tenders," he said. "Both are seniors, and both have good ability."

The two are Terry Denny and Bob Gebro.

Egan also praised the efforts of three senior defensemen. They are Sullivan, Phil Viviamore, who missed some games due to a broken finger, and Mike Varney.

As the season draws to a close, Egan will find himself losing twelve graduating seniors.

Also, as the season closes, those seniors will have to make decisions on their plans for the future.

Both Norton and Valade have decided to attend Clarkson College.

Norton said he will be at the school on a sports scholarship and will probably major in industrial management.

Valade said he would like to play hockey in college but added, "It's not my major objective in college." He said he will seek a degree in chemical engineering.

The third member of the trio, King, said he is considering attending either Canton ATC or North Country Community College. "I want to play hockey in college," he said.

Potsdam-Plattsburgh Games Rescheduled

Potsdam State Athletic Director Jerry Welsh has announced the rescheduled dates of State University Conference games between Potsdam and Plattsburgh State Basketball teams.

This reshuffling was necessitated after weather conditions forced the postponement of the Jan. 24 scheduled game between the two colleges.

Today's (Tuesday) game originally scheduled to be played at Potsdam, will now be held at Plattsburgh and the make-up date for the postponed game will be Feb. 24 at 8 p.m. in Potsdam's Maxey Hall gym.

The switch of sites was necessary because Plattsburgh's gym is booked for that college's Winter Carnival Ball on Feb. 24.

The State University Conference champion receives an automatic bid to the NCAA post-season tournament and

the SUNYAC season must be completed by Feb. 24.

At present, Plattsburgh is leading the conference with a 3-0 record, while the Potsdam Bears at 5-1 in SUNYAC play, are tied for second with Albany and Oneonta.

Welsh also announced that Potsdam will now travel to Hartwick on Monday, Feb. 26. Hartwick consented to a two-day postponement of its game with Potsdam (originally scheduled for Feb. 24) to permit the Bears to fulfill their SUNYAC commitment on time.
