Percussion Ensemble To Perform

State University College at Potsdam's Crane Percussion Ensemble, conducted by Prof. James Peterscak, will present a concert at 8:15 p.m. Feb. 27, in the Crane School of Music's Snell Music Theater.

The 19-member ensemble will present four new works, including the world premiere performances of Murray Houllif's "Three Movements" for multi-percussionist and percussion quartet, and Jiri Laburda's "Sonata," for piano and percussion instruments. Town Clerk Notes Marriage Regulations

EDITOR'S NOTE: The interest in spring weddings brings many questions from couples regarding the laws and regulations for obtaining marriage licenses. Town Clerk Mary Frost has prepared the following helpful hints. Any further questions may be directed to Mrs. Frost at 265-3430.

What is the legal age to get a marriage license?

18 years of age.

If I'm under 18, what do I have to do?

Both parents have to sign a consent before a Notary Public.

What do I need for proof of age?

Besides either a driver's license, birth certificate, or baptismal certificate, you can use a passport, life insurance policy, or employment certificate. Also acceptable is a school record, immigration or naturalization record, or a court record.

Are blood tests required?

Yes. Go to the doctor of your choice. The test results are good for a period of 30 days.

Is there a waiting period before I can apply for my marriage license?

Yes, You cannot get your marriage license until at least nine days from the date the blood was drawn.
