### Summer Camp Offers Learning On Environment

The Camp Colby Summer camp program for young people interested in the environment is again being offered by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation according to John E. Wilson, regional director, Watertown.

This camp program for boys and girls 12 to 14 years of age combines outdoor instruction in freshwater biology, environmental management practices, ecology, soils and plants, wildlife and woodlots. Hunter and boating safety training are optionally available with a certificate of competence awarded to those who qualify, Wilson said.

The usual summer recreational activities of canoeing, swimming, fishing, archery, camping skills and athletics are also part of the program. Camp Colby near Saranac Lake, is reserved for boys and girls who reside in the counties of Herkimer, Oneida, Lewis, Jefferson and St. Lawrence for the weeks of July 1-9 and July 8-14.

Boys and girls are taken on a first-come first-serve basis. Students may be sponsored by an organization such as a sportsman's Club, church group, school, environmental commission, service club, volunteer fire department, fraternal organization, etc., although this requirement is no longer mandatory. The tuition fee is \$90 per week.
