Youths Arrested

In Burglary

Two young men were jailed Friday and two girls arrested in connection with a burglary at Dan's Corner Market, Raymondville, on Jan. 2, according to the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Department.

Jailed were Timothy Osoway, 19, Chase Mills, and a 16-year-old Potsdam youth whose name was not released due to his age. Both were charged with third degree burglary and taken to St. Lawrence County Jail in lieu of \$500 bail apiece, according to Detective Sgt. Dominic Germano of the sheriff's department.

Also charged with third degree burglary were two Potsdam girls, one aged 17 and the other 16. Their names were not released because of their ages. They were released in the custody of their parents pending action by a grand jury.

All four were arraigned before Town of Norfolk Justice James Sabad. According to Germano, the four are suspected in a burglary at the market in which lottery money totaling \$1,679 cash was taken. He said that entry was gained at night through a window in the establishment.
