## Killing Dog Was Wrong, Judge Rules

"You're asking me to put a price tag on a part of my family."

That was how Philip Mongada, 59 Pine St., expressed his frustration at the dilemma he encountered in small claims court last Wednesday before Village Justice Robert Halliday.

Because Mongada, seeking a \$350 award in damages from a neighbor who killed Mongada's dog, found that the law would only allow him to collect monetary damages that could be concretely established, such as with a sales receipt or pedigree papers.

Still, Mongada did win a moral victory of sorts when Halliday ruled that the neighbor, Frederick Barto, 73 Pine St., "was in error" in shooting and killing Mongada's dog.

The black Labrador retriever, named Abraham, was given to Mongada and his wife Pat as a gift. Because of that, there were no papers establishing pedigree or value of the animal.

According to Judge Halliday, the law does not provide for monetary damages to account for "sentimental value" of a loss, even in the loss of a human life.

## Man, Woman Jailed Didn't Pay For Room, Police Say

CANTON- A Potsdam woman and a Massena man were both in county jail Tuesday morning following their arrests Monday by members of the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Department. Bail was set at \$250 each.

Charged with theft of services were Tina Mackey, 20, 29 Washington St., Potsdam; and William Gardner, 32, Massena. It is alleged that the two had stayed in a room at the Motel Aron in Massena for two weeks and then left without paying a \$94 bill.

The arrests were made about 1 p.m. Monday by Detective Sgt. Dominic Germano and deputies Billings and Hollinger.

Ms. Mackey had been arrested last week on a charge of unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. It was alleged that she had rented a 1979 Mustang from Scott Ford in Potsdam and then failed to return it. Details of that arrest are in the week's "Public Record" elsewhere in this paper.

"The attack, if any, was over." According to a section of the state Agriculture and Markets Law, destruction of a dog is warranted "while" the dog is "attacking, chasing, or worrying" another domestic animal.

By his own testimony, Barto said that the dogs were not fighting at the time he shot Mongada's seven-year-old retriever in the right hindquarter. They were about five feet apart and he stood about 25 feet from them, he told the court.

Instead, Judge Halliday reserved a decision on the amount of damages, saying that he would look into the matter and report back within a week. A decision is expected Wednesday.

Barto testified that Mongada's dog had been fighting with his own dog prior to the shooting. Barto's 15-year-old dog, "blind in one eye," he said, was tied to a tree in his yard and the two animals were tangled in the leash when he observed them and went back into his house for a shotgun.

Halliday ruled in favor of Mongada, saying that at the time of the shooting,

Barton said that his own dog became lame day after the alleged fight and that he wanted the animal destroyed.

Barto was represented in court by Potsdam Attorney David Demarest. Demarest attempted to establish that because Barto had called village police immediately after killing the dog, he had not acted with malice.

## Etching Missing, Reward Offered

Two works of art were stolen from the State University College, Potsdam, on Feb. 21, reports the college security department.

The black on white etching by Valeriano Trubbiani, purchased by the college curator, Roland Gibson, in Italy in 1966, was removed from its frame after the glass covering was broken. The etching was hung in the north smoking room of Cramb Library. It measures 13 by 10 inches.

The silver colored aluminum sculpture by Daniel Wardell, a graduate of the college, measures 60x20 inches. It had been displayed in the northeast corner second floor, of the College Union

for several years. It was returned to the college on Saturday afternoon and has been replaced in its regular location.

The etching is valued at \$100 and the sculpture at more than \$250.

A \$100 reward is offered for information leading to the apprehension and prosecution of the person who stole the etching. Anyone seeing either work is urged to telephone either the art department, 268-5040 or campus security, 268-2885.

The etching is labeled in the lower left-hand corner, 12-50, indicating that it was the 12th print run off of a total of 50 prints.


