

Open House Culminates Two Years' Work On Senior Citizen Housing

STAR LAKE: There's a story told in Star Lake about the difficulty of the first settlers had starting a cemetery here. It seems everyone was too tough to die; they finally had to shoot one reluctant old-timer just to get things moving.

Well, they've been dying up here regularly ever since, if for no other reason than to keep the cemetery open. But they're still a hardy breed and many

wouldn't think of packing their bags and heading south when retirement comes. Instead they're more likely to move from lonely, drafty trailers or homes grown too burdensome into one of Star Lake's compact new rental housing units.

The 16 FHA-financed apartments housed in two long buildings at the corner of Young's Road and Lake Road are close to competition with an open house scheduled for Sunday afternoon, March 4, from 1 to 5 p.m.

The event will culminate two years of work by a representative group of people from the Towns of Clifton and Fine with the aid of many individuals, agencies and businesses around the North Country.

The group, having worked together previously, decided to stay together to initiate a project of benefit to the community. Various ideas were considered, from a public beach to an extended-care facility for the Clifton-Fine Hospital, with the final decision being made in favor of rent-subsidized housing for the elderly.

A survey was conducted as required

by HUD (Housing and Urban Development) to determine the need for such housing. Results were favorable and on Dec. 12, 1976, the group, working through Attorney Philip Kenny of Star Lake, incorporated as a not-for-profit organization under the name South St. Lawrence Corporation.

Bureaucratic Maze
 The fledgling group was guided through the maze of bureaucratic rules and regulations with help from Al Belto and his staff at the Watertown offices of Catholic Charities. Applications were filed with HUD. Syracuse architects Finnegan, Lyon and Colburn drew up the plans which had to be approved by FHA before bids were let.

Construction under Equal Opportunity and Fair Housing guidelines, the units are available to any person 62 years and older living on a limited income. Although this eliminates discrimination, there is one factor the government can't control—the weather. But if you're a tough old chicken, undaunted by Adirondack winters, there's nothing to stop you from applying to South St. Lawrence Planning Corporation, Box

163, Star Lake, N.Y., 13690, for one of the several remaining vacancies. One application has even come in from Florida. However, most have been received as a result of ads placed in a local shopper's newsletter, and informational visits by corporation representatives to each village in the Towns of Clifton and Fine.

Rental of the units is regulated under a HUD rent-subsidy program. Renters pay one fourth of their monthly income toward the \$240-a-month rent and \$40-a-month electric fee. Any difference is covered by HUD.

One Bedroom Units
 The airy, 546-square foot one-bedroom apartments are carpeted and electrically heated with individually controlled thermostats on each baseboard heater. However, on a sunny day, even with temperatures at 20 below, very little heat is needed thanks to a southern exposure, 12 inches of insulation in the ceiling, 6 inches in the outside walls, thermopane windows, a large double

thermopane sliding door and interior walls of 1/2-inch fireboard. Drapes and curtains, to be added by residents, will complete the energy conservation picture.

Special features in each unit include a time-controlled ceiling heater in the bathroom, a smoke detector, and two phone jacks. A TV antenna system was added to the basic plan as the result of action taken by the Towns of Clifton and Fine, each of which voted to allocate \$1,200 for this purpose and for the purchase of office furniture.

Two apartments have been specifically designed and constructed with low cupboards, sinks, grab bars and a "roll-in" shower for use by persons in wheelchairs. A laundry room equipped with four coin-operated washer-dryer units is available and residents may use a Pullman-kitchen equipped community room for gatherings.

Outside, free-standing lampposts and an absence of unsightly telephone and

electric lines attest to the unseen presence of underground utilities, further enhancing the already attractive view across the open hilltop expanse of an old airfield, over a deep valley and away to the near-distance horizon of wooded slopes.

It would take an active imagination at this time of year, or a lot of snow shovelling to prove it, but contractor Don Ritchie of Gouverneur promises there is a black-topped parking lot and plenty of sidewalks, front and back, somewhere under all that snow.

Come spring he will seed in a large grassy area, with further landscaping a project for corporation, community and residents to work on.

In the meantime, Star Lake's tradition of being a home for hardy northern types will continue uncontested as the new residents start moving in and settling down to enjoy their retirement years basking in the sunshine of their living rooms right here in the frozen north.

Forty-nine students from eight high schools in St. Lawrence County have successfully completed the High School Enrichment Program at Clarkson College in computer mathematics and advanced chemistry.

Each of these students has been awarded a certificate showing satisfactory completion of the work required. The program consisted of ten three-hour Saturday morning sessions which started in early September. Professor Raymond B. Andrews, a member of the Clarkson Chemistry faculty and director of the Enrichment Program, explained that the High School Enrichment Program teaches high ability students subject matter not usually covered at the high school level. The chemistry program is taught by Professor Andrews, and computer mathematics by Professors R. Gerald Bradshaw and Richard J. Miller of the Clarkson mathematics faculty.
