Tuition Tax Credits Backed

WASHINGTON—Rep. Robert C. McEwen, is cosponsoring two bills to provide a system of tuition tax credits to reduce the burden of education cost for the majority of American families. The first bill would allow parents of college and post-secondary vocational school students to subtract 25 percent of annual tuition bills from their federal income taxes due, up to ceilings of \$250 in 1979 and \$500 in 1980. The second proposal would permit parents of nonprofit elementary and secondary school children to subtract 25 percent of their yearly tuition expenses up to a maximum of \$100 in 1979 and \$200 in 1980 from their income taxes due. Further, the bills provide that the amount taken into account for tuition payments is to be offset on a dollar-for-dollar basis for money received as a nontaxable scholarship or education assistance allowance. "These are modest proposals and offer reasonable and constructive approaches to the rapidly increasing costs of education and afford significant relief to parents and students. The bills provide, moreover, the most simple, direct and fair form of aid to the hard-pressed families that are in such desperate need of some type of relief from the soaring tuition costs," McEwen said.

A majority of 30th Congressional District residents who responded to McEwen's 1978 questionnaire said they felt taxpayers should receive tax credits for part of tuition paid to a private school or college, his office said.
